MOHAN Foundation (Multi Organ Harvesting Aid Network) is conducting training programmes in transplant coordination and grief counselling – a first in South Asia.

Multi Organ Harvesting Aid Network based in Chennai, Hyderabad, Vizag and Coimbatore is organising one week, one month, three month and six month training programmes in the specialised area of transplant coordination. Graduates in Sciences, social work, hospital management, medical psychology, sociology, nursing, physiotherapy, besides nursing and medicine are eligible to apply. In addition, graduates in any field with good communication skills and an interest in the area of organ donation can do the courseThe programme involves training in counselling families of "brain dead" patients to donate organs and coordinating the entire process of organ donation, retrieval and transplantation. The candidates are trained in all aspects of counselling with intense one-on-one role play by experienced Transplant Coordinators from across the country. At the end of the course, every successful participant will be in a position to create a roadmap for initiating an organ donation programme in his or her hospital/city/region and work as the key resource person to spearhead transplant-related activities.

Placement opportunities will be provided wherever possible. The Government of India in its recent gazette titled THE TRANSPLANTATION OF HUMAN ORGANS RULES, 1995 (GSR NO. 51(E), dr. 4-2-1995) [As amended vide GSR 571(E), dt.31-7-2008] has made transplant coordinator nomination mandatory before a hospital is registered as a transplant hospital. This would mean that the 300 hospitals applying for renewal of license would need to have a trained transplant coordinator in place.
