MOHAN Foundation was formed to be a facilitator of cadaver organ donation and transplant programs once the Transplant of Human Organ Act, 1994 was passed. MOHAN is an acronym for Multi Organ Harvesting Aid Network. It is a not-for-profit, non-governmental organization by philanthropists and medical professionals keen to promote cadaver organ donations. It is a registered NGO with Income Tax exemption under Section 80G and 35AC. MOHAN Foundation offices are based in Chennai, Hyderabad, Visakhapatnam, Coimbatore, Delhi-NCR, Chandigarh and Bangalore.

The Foundation has been organising training programs in the specialised area of transplant coordination for various durations of one week, one month, three month and six months. Graduates in Sciences, Social Work, Hospital Management, Medical Psychology, Sociology, Nursing, and Physiotherapy are eligible to apply. In addition, graduates in any field with good communication skills and an interest in the area of organ donation can do the course. The program involves training in counseling families of "brain dead" patients to donate organs and coordinating the entire process of organ donation, retrieval

and transplantation. The candidates are trained in all aspects of counseling with intense one-on-one role play by experienced Transplant Coordinators from across the country. At the end of the course, every successful participant will be in a position to create a roadmap for initiating an organ donation program in his or her hospital/city/region and work as the key resource person to spearhead transplant-related activities.

In addition, a one year Postgraduate Diploma in Transplant Coordination has been started under the aegis of "MOHAN Foundation-IGNOU Community College". More information on the courses, application form, faculty list and alumni is available at <http://courses.mohanfoundation.org>.
