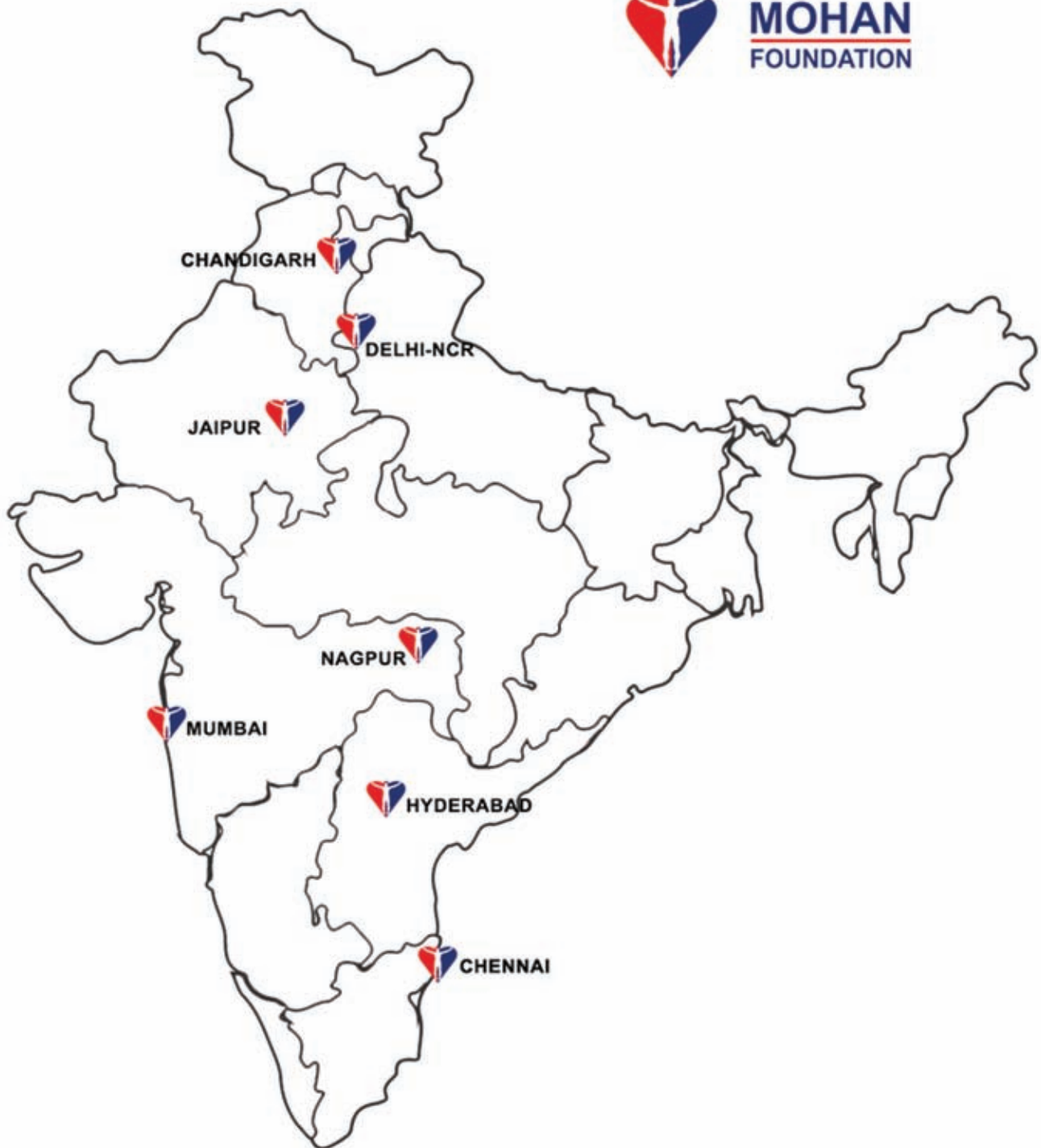

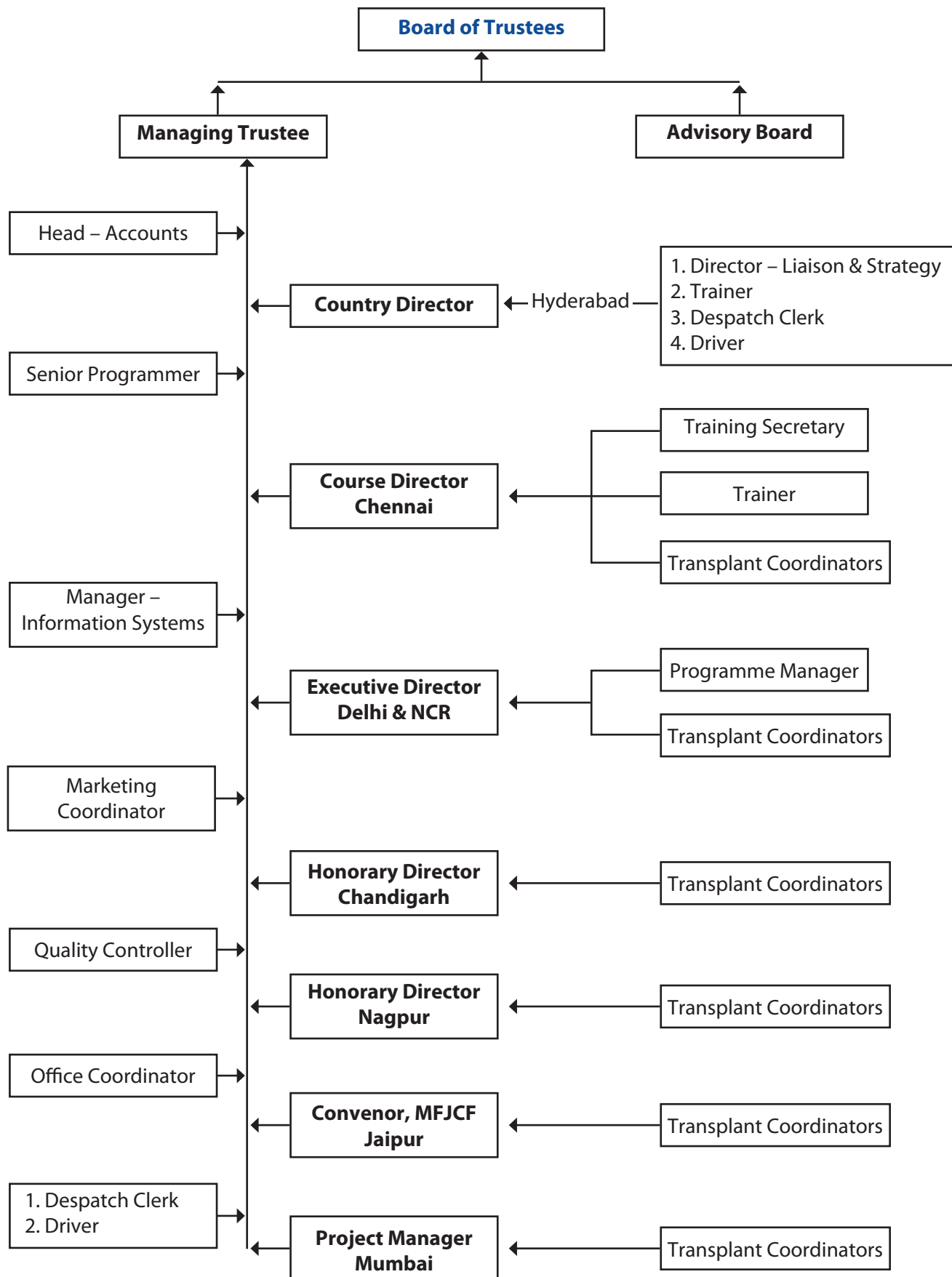

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ABOUT MOHAN FOUNDATION

Introduction

MOHAN is an acronym for Multi Organ Harvesting Aid Network and was established in 1997. It is a not-for-profit, non-governmental organization started to promote organ donation. It is registered as a Trust vide Register No. 285 of 98 dated 4th August 1997 in Tamil Nadu. It has Income Tax exemption under Section 80G and 35AC. We are approved recipients under the Foreign Contributions Regulatory Act, 1976.

History

January 12, 1997- the day MOHAN Foundation started its journey in Chennai to give patients with organ failure a new lease of life. Organ donation and transplantation has made it possible for people with organ failure to look forward to a brighter tomorrow filled with hope and promise. It is the brainchild of a group of highly motivated, concerned and non-commercial group of practicing medical professionals and non-medical professionals to promote the cause of "Organ Donation". The Foundation works to increase the reach of the Transplantation of Human Organs Act, which was passed by the Government of India in 1994 to broaden the concept of organ donation and stop commercial dealings in organs, especially kidneys.

The Foundation has offices in Chennai (H.Q), Hyderabad, Delhi-NCR, Bengaluru, Jaipur, Mumbai, Chandigarh, Nagpur and USA. MOHAN Foundation has embarked upon yet another major milestone with the creation of MOHAN USA in 2011.

- To ensure that no Indian dies for want of an organ

- To ensure that every Indian that is suffering from end-stage organ failure be provided with the gift of a "New lease of Life", through a lifesaving organ transplant.

Objectives

- To promote public education programs so that a cross section of our population is aware about the need to donate one's organs
- To create a network of hospitals that can be a source of organ donations
- To liaise with the Government of India and State Government to pass favourable legislations that will augment organ donations
- To network with organ donation agencies so that no organ is ever wasted
- To train health care professionals in transplant coordination, so that they may efficiently and effectively counsel the families of "brain dead" victims to donate their loved ones' organs
- To raise resources to support organ donation related activities

PUBLIC EDUCATION

MOHAN Foundation regularly organizes awareness events to a cross section of population. Over 2.5 million donor cards have been distributed in English, Tamil, Telugu, Marathi and Hindi. The Foundation also has literature on organ donation and prevention of different diseases.

Public Education Programs across the country

Educating the public about organ donation has been our constant endeavour for the last 19 years. This is done through awareness programs, information stalls, distributing public IEC (Information, Education and Communication) materials and organ donor cards, creating awareness through press and media and by regularly doing public functions with themes related to organ donation.

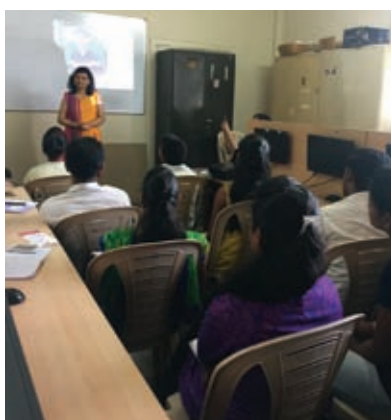

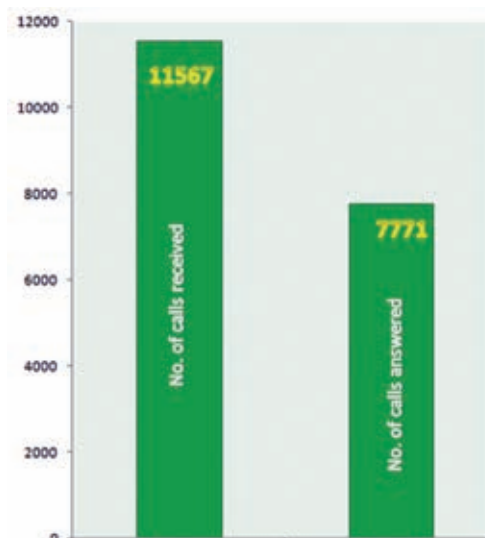

Organ Donation Toll Free Helpline



National Organ Donation Toll Free Helpline was initiated by MOHAN Foundation in 2013. The objective of this helpline is to provide service which offers information, support, guidance and referral for all those concerned with any aspect of organ donation and transplantation.

We are providing this service to the public in eight languages – English, Hindi, Telugu, Tamil, Kannada, Malayalam, Marathi and Oriya.

Publications

a. **Indian Transplant Newsletter (ITN)** – The Indian Transplant Newsletter is being published since 1998 and is currently in its 49th issue. It carries national and international transplant news and keeps track of the Indian deceased donor organ transplant program. The executive committee has doctors from the transplant field from all over the country and abroad. About 1000 copies of the newsletter are dispatched every quarter to transplant clinicians and members of the public in India and abroad.

TRANSPLANT COORDINATORS' TRAINING PROGRAM

Transplant coordinators play a pivotal role in the success of the deceased donation and transplantation program. The Government of India in its recent amendment entitled "The Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Act, 2011" has made transplant coordinators' nomination mandatory before a hospital is registered as a transplant hospital.

To address the training needs of this cadre of health care professionals, MOHAN Foundation started a structured "Transplant Coordinators' Training Program" in the year 2009. Depending on the requirement of the candidates it runs courses of various durations from one week to one year.

From April 2016 to March 2017, 8 one week transplant coordinators' training programs were conducted out of which 365 candidates were trained across the country. All these training programs were conducted under the aegis of **National Organ & Tissue Transplant Organization (NOTTO), Directorate General of Health Services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India. (NOTTO is an apex body for all India activities of coordination and networking for procurement and distribution of Organs and Tissues and registry of Organs and Tissues Donation and Transplantation in the country)**

These training programs received funding from the Tata Trusts, Mumbai and SBI Foundation, Mumbai.

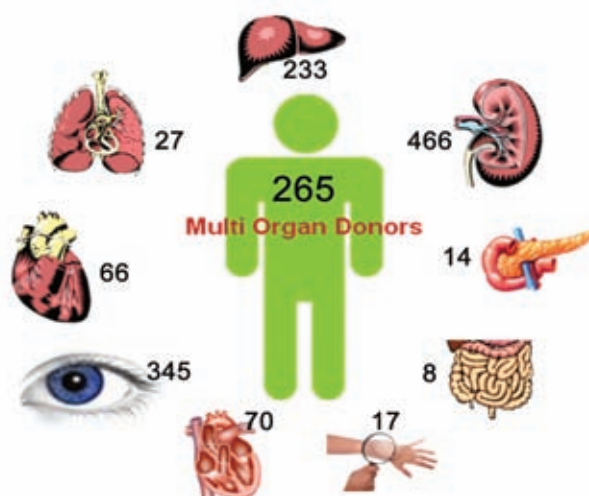
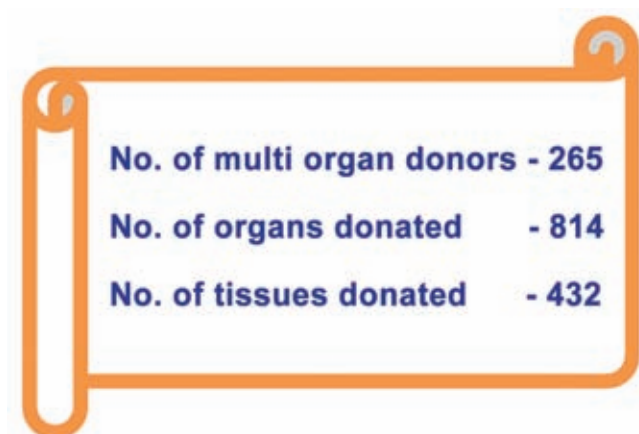

STANDARDIZING TRANSPLANT CARE AND MAKING IT AFFORDABLE

A two day conference on “Standardizing Transplant Care and Making it Affordable” was held on 24th & 25th June 2016 at Fortune Park JP Celestial, Bengaluru. The meeting was conducted under the aegis of Indian Society of Organ Transplantation (ISOT) and supported by NOTTO, ISOT, MOHAN Foundation, ZCKK and Integrated Liver Care Foundation. The Inaugural Function was graced by Dr. Jagdish Prasad, Director General of Health Services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of Tamil Nadu and Dr. Kiran Mazumdar Shaw, CMD, Biocon Limited.

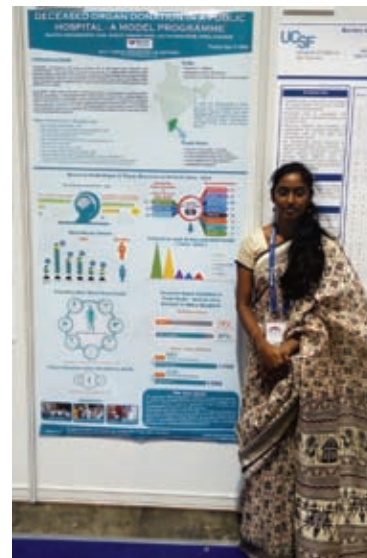

MOHAN Foundation has been instrumental in setting up and maintaining web-based registry of brain dead organ donors & patients awaiting transplant in Tamil Nadu (Tamil Nadu Network for Organ Sharing – www.tnos.org) and Kerala (Kerala Network for Organ Sharing – www.knos.org.in and Rajasthan – (Rajasthan Network for Organ Sharing – www.rnos.org)

The purpose of Transplant Registry is to collect transplant related data from various centres in the state and to be able to collate the data derive the following information –

- ◆ Waiting list of recipients from various centres
- ◆ Deceased organ and tissue donation data of the state
- ◆ Deceased donor data
- ◆ Organ distribution
- ◆ Essential demographic data of patients undergoing transplants
