



ABOUT MOHAN FOUNDATION

Introduction

MOHAN is an acronym for Multi Organ Harvesting Aid Network and was established in 1997. It is a not-for-profit, non-governmental organization started to promote organ donation. It is registered as a Trust vide Register No. 285 of 98 dated 4th August 1997 in Tamil Nadu. It has Income Tax exemption under Section 80G and 35AC. We are approved recipients under the Foreign Contributions Regulatory Act, 1976.

History:

January 12, 1997- the day MOHAN Foundation started its journey in Chennai to give patients with organ failure a new lease of life. Organ donation and transplantation has made it possible for people with organ failure to look forward to a brighter tomorrow filled with hope and promise. It is the brainchild of a group of highly motivated, concerned and non-commercial group of practicing medical professionals and non-medical professionals to promote the cause of "Organ Donation". The Foundation works to increase the reach of the Transplantation of Human Organs Act, which was passed by the Government of India in 1994 to broaden the concept of organ donation and stop commercial dealings in organs, especially kidneys.

The Foundation has offices in Chennai (H.Q), Hyderabad, Delhi-NCR, Bengaluru, Jaipur, Mumbai, Chandigarh, Nagpur and USA. MOHAN Foundation has embarked upon yet another major milestone with the creation of MOHAN USA in 2011.

• To ensure that no Indian dies for want of an organ

Mission:

• To ensure that every Indian that is suffering from end-stage organ failure be provided with the gift of a "New lease of Life", through a lifesaving organ transplant.

Objectives:

- To promote public education programs so that a cross section of our population is aware about the need to donate one's organs
- To create a network of hospitals that can be a source of organ donations
- To liaise with the Government of India and State Government to pass favourable legislations that will augment organ donations
- To network with organ donation agencies so that no organ is ever wasted
- To train health care professionals in transplant coordination, so that they may efficiently and effectively counsel the families of "brain dead" victims to donate their loved ones' organs
- To raise resources to support organ donation related activities

1. PUBLIC EDUCATION

MOHAN Foundation regularly organises awareness events to a cross section of population. Over 2.5 million donor cards have been distributed in English, Tamil, Telugu, Marathi and Hindi. The Foundation also has literature on organ donation and prevention of different diseases.

Public Education Programs across the country

Educating the public about organ donation has been our constant endeavour for the last 21 years. This is done through awareness programs, information stalls, distributing public IEC (Information, Education and Communication) materials and organ donor cards, creating awareness through press and media and by regularly doing public functions with themes related to organ donation.

Ms. Pallavi Kumar, Executive Director MOHAN Foundation ran the Airtel Delhi Half Marathon held on November 19, 2017 to support the cause of organ donation and create awareness on the same. MOHAN Foundation was announced as the Second Runner-Up of 'CSO WITH MOST SUPPORTERS' with contributions from 70 supporters.





METRO RETRO

Metro Retro - A Celebration of Life - Musical concert by renowned Carnatic music vocalists Ranjani & Gayatri was organised by MOHAN Foundation on 3rd December, 2017. In a first-ever musical event, the Carnatic music concert was organised at the Vadapalani Metro Station, Chennai.

December 3 happens to be the golden jubilee of the first human heart transplant performed by South African cardiac Surgeon Dr. Christiaan Barnard on 3rd December, 1967. The event was organised to celebrate the Golden Jubilee of the first heart transplant in the world and to acknowledge heart transplants being done in India more so in Tamil Nadu. It was also the 20th anniversary of the MOHAN Foundation

Present in the audience was Dr. J. Radhakrishnan, IAS, Principal Secretary, Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of Tamil Nadu who has always supported the cause of organ donation.

MOHAN Foundation took this golden opportunity to also thank the donor families for their noble gesture to save the lives. The family of Late. Aishwarya (13 years) was honoured for coming forward to donate her organs and tissues in October 2016. A few heart recipients were also felicitated during the event.

The musical sisters readily accepted the offer to spread the message of organ donation through their singing. One of the numbers rendered by the sisters was their main piece "Vallamai Tharayo" in "Mohanam" Ragam dedicating it to organ donation and the Foundation. One could see the audience tapping their hands or swaying their heads to the musical beat, while others preferred getting into the music and listening with their eyes closed. Many passersby stopped to hear their melodious voices.



























RANGOLI COMPETITION AT METRO STATION TO PRMOTE THE NOBLE CAUSE

The open air car park of the Thirumangalam Metro Station was transformed to an art exhibition area to promote organ donation. MOHAN Foundation organised a Rangoli Competition in association with Chennai Metro Rail Limited (CMRL) on 6th January 2018 at the Thirumangalam Metro Station.

The theme of the Rangoli was 'அழியாதகோலங்கள்' (Indelible Designs) — Organ Donation. The participation was open to all. Chennai rangoli enthusiast wholeheartedly participated in the competition. There were 13 pairs of students from 8 colleges of Chennai and 26 pairs of older women who created beautifully thought out designs to bring out the concept of organ donation. Exciting prizes and gifts were given to the winners and participants. The youngest participant was 7 years and eldest was 62 years old.

Public events such as a Rangoli competition create curiosity in the minds of the public. This event was in unique partnership between CMRL and MOHAN Foundation for the promotion of a noble cause. Many visitors registered as donors and picked a donor card.





LIFE BEFORE ASHES - ORGAN DONATION APPEAL MADE COMPELLING BY USE OF HUMAN ASHES

'Life before Ashes' is a poignant, yet hard-hitting, message by MOHAN Foundation to spread a very simple message - 'What has now become ashes, could have been another person's heart or kidney, if only the organs were donated.' In January 2018, the Foundation has created a set of art installations of human organs to highlight this urgency and make the public think about organ donation.

The human organ installations are made from a mix of real human ashes and mud from graves. This idea stems from the insight that people are ready to allow their organs to be burnt and wasted, but they aren't willing to let their organs give a new life to someone. The installations are meant to make people think about the need of organ donation while also urging them to sign up and become organ donors.

The campaign tries to expand the notion of organ transplant by emphasizing on the merits of organ donation, highlighting the declining number of registrations and bringing to focus the social stigma attached to organ donation in India.

The installations have travelled to various hospitals, malls and public places across Mumbai and Delhi.

QUTAB MINAR TURNS GREEN FOR ORGAN DONATION DURING "SAMARTHAN 2018"

On February 17, 2018, the iconic Qutab Minar was bathed in green to highlight the cause of organ donation during the annual event by MOHAN Foundation titled 'Samarthan 2018,' held at the terrace of Qla at Mehrauli, New Delhi.

The Qutab Minar was lit in green because the green ribbon symbolises hope for those who are waiting for a second chance at life through transplantation. Most importantly, it conveys our gratitude to Organ Donors and their families for giving the greatest gift of all, the gift of life.

The annual Samarthan event is an attempt by the Foundation to bring together all the policy makers, public & private hospitals and NGO's working in the field of organ donation to raise awareness on the need for coordinated efforts of all, given the fact that India has an abysmal organ donation rate of 0.8 per million population, ranking amongst the lowest in the world.

The event featured the renowned stand-up comedian Jeeveshu Ahluwalia whose humour style is derived from observational everyday conversations, quirky monologues, peculiar situations and some eccentric friends.

At the event, the Foundation showcased an exhibition titled "Life before Ashes" featuring human organ installations made from a mix of real human ashes and mud. Also featured was an exhibition titled "Nafas" that had travelled all the way from Iran. Nafas (meaning "breath" in Persian) was the first Nafas visual arts festival on the topic of Organ Donation held by Iranian Society of Organ Donation with Iranian Artists' Forum.

The Foundation also released a film on "Counseling potential donor families" at the event. It is a film made by MOHAN Foundation (adapted from a film by NHS Blood and Transplant, UK) on how the treating physician along with the Transplant Coordinator can approach a family to request for organ donation.















ANGELS OF CHANGE

"Angels of Change" is a unique program launched by MOHAN Foundation in which selected volunteers are taken through a customized training module to enable them to undertake awareness initiatives on organ donation amongst various audiences.

This Volunteer Training is available in all our centres. The training comprises basic awareness session, discussion, FAQs, interactions with recipients or donor families and meeting with experts. After the training, volunteers are expected to conduct a minimum of two public awareness talks or campaigns and this shall be done under the guidance of MOHAN Foundation as part of completion of the training. Every trainee gets a completion certificate. The training is supported by SBI Foundation.

This unique program was conducted at various places in Chennai, Delhi-NCR and Mumbai (36 programs) and 1072 volunteers were trained.











ORGAN DONATION TOLL FREE HELPLINE

National Organ Donation Toll Free Helpline was initiated by MOHAN Foundation in 2013. The objective of this helpline is to provide service which offers information, support, guidance and referral for all those concerned with any aspect of organ donation and transplantation.




2. PUBLICATIONS

a. Indian Transplant Newsletter (ITN)

The Indian Transplant Newsletter is being published since 1998 and is currently in its 52nd issue. It carries national and international transplant news and keeps track of the Indian deceased donor organ transplant program. The executive committee has doctors from the transplant field from all over the country and abroad. About 1000 copies of the newsletter are dispatched every quarter to transplant clinicians and members of the public in India and abroad.

3. TRANSPLANT COORDINATORS' TRAINING PROGRAM

Transplant coordinators play a pivotal role in the success of the deceased donation and transplantation program. The Government of India in its recent amendment entitled "The Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Act, 2011" has made transplant coordinators' nomination mandatory before a hospital is registered as a transplant hospital.

To address the training needs of this cadre of health care professionals, MOHAN Foundation started a structured "Transplant Coordinators' Training Program" in the year 2009. Depending on the requirement of the candidates it runs courses of various durations from one week to one year.

From April 2017 to March 2018, 7 one week and 1 one month transplant coordinators' training programs were conducted through which 378 candidates were trained across the country. All these training programs were conducted under the aegis of **NOTTO and different ROTTOs and SOTTOs.**

These training programs received funding from the Tata Trusts, Mumbai and SBI Foundation, Mumbai.

MOHAN FOUNDATION PARTICIPATES IN MINI FELLOWSHIP IN ORGAN DONATION AT GIFT OF LIFE INSTITUTE, PHILADELPHIA, USA – OCTOBER 2017

Dr. Sumana Navin, Course Director and Ms. Sujatha Suriyamoorthi, Manager-Information Systems, MOHAN Foundation underwent Gift of Life Institute's (GOLI) Mini Fellowship in Organ Donation from 23rd October 2017 to 3rd November 2017 in USA. This fellowship was facilitated under the auspices of the International Cooperation Agreement signed between Gift of Life Institute, Philadelphia and MOHAN Foundation in 2015. One of the objectives of the agreement was facilitating the enhancement of the deceased donation and transplantation programme in India through education and training of donation and transplantation professionals in the country.

The Mini Fellowship comprised didactic sessions, observational learning, workshops and special events.

Didactic Sessions: Gift of Life Donor Program manages every facet of the donation process, coordinates the recovery of organs and tissues, and allocates the organs to suitable recipients as per UNOS (United Network for Organ Sharing) allocation policies. ANNUAL TRANSPLANT COORDINATORS' CONFERENCE - INDORE - OCTOBER 2017

National Association of Transplant Coordinators and MOHAN Foundation, under the aegis of Indian Society of Organ Transplantation (ISOT) held its 10th Annual Transplant Coordinators' Conference at Brilliant Convention Centre, Indore held between 13th and 14th October, 2017.

Over 80 transplant coordinators from across the country participated actively. The conference was formally inaugurated by Dr. Vimal Bhandari - Director of NOTTO, Dr. Anant Kumar – President of ISOT, Dr. Manish Rathi – Secretary of ISOT, Dr. Umesh Oza – Past President of ISOT, and Dr. Sunil Shroff – Managing Trustee of MOHAN Foundation. International guests from MOHAN USA were Dr. Manjula Balasubramanian and Dr. Balasubramanian. Mrs. Rachna Dubey from Indore Society of Organ Donation was also present.

During the inaugural ceremony, the 50th Issue of Indian Transplant Newsletter was released by Dr. Anant Kumar. Dr. Sumana Navin presented copies of the newsletter to all the guests present.

The conference had a variety of topics covering the Transplantation of Human Organs Act, Uniform Declaration of Death Act, Swap transplants, dealing with angry and difficult families and documentation in live related and unrelated transplants.

The valedictory function was held on the evening of 14th October, and Dr. Anant Kumar gave away all the awards.

The "Swamy Narayan Best Transplant Coordinator Award" was presented to Mr. Shankarganesh of Global Hospitals. The Best oral paper award was received by Ms. Anitta Francis, Transplant Coordinator, Aster Medcity, Kochi. Mr. Satish of Tagore Medical College received the Best poster award. Dr. Hemal Kanvinde received the award on his behalf.





ADVANCED TRANSPLANT COORDINATORS WORKSHOP - CHENNAI - MARCH 2018

The Advanced Transplant Coordinators Workshop was held on the 23rd and 24th of March 2018 in Chennai. The theme of the workshop 'Let us Refocus' helped the participants of MOHAN Foundation from Delhi, Mumbai, Nagpur, Hyderabad, Madurai, Salem, Coimbatore and Chennai focus on the cause and share their views.

Dr. Darius Mirza, Professor of HPB and Transplant Surgery, University Hospital Birmingham and Birmingham Children's Hospital was the guest speaker. He explained on the benefits of Donation after Cardiac Death, he also put forth the question to the audience 'DCD in India – Is India ready?' Ms. Jayanthi Sampathkumar, IT Manager, Microsoft spoke about her journey as a marathoner, how the idea of running in a saree was birthed and what pushed her to make the cut for the Guinness Book of World Records. She focused on the importance of mental strength in addition to physical fitness.

Dr. Anirban Bose, Nephrologist, Strong Memorial Hospital, United States via Skype spoke about the roles of MOHAN USA and its accomplishments thus far, he went on to speak about the upcoming fundraiser in Seattle, USA.





4. CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION (CME) / SEMINAR / WORKSHOP / SENSITIZATION PROGRAMS

All brain death identification takes place either in Accident & Emergency (A & E) or in the Intensive Care Units (ICU). In view of this, it is important to conduct CME programs for the key staff - ICU doctors, ICU Nurses, A & E Doctors, A & E Nurses and paramedical staff on issues related to brain death and its implications for the deceased organ donation program.





A CRITICAL CARE WORKSHOP ON 'DECLARATION OF BRAIN DEATH AND DONOR OPTIMIZATION' IN MUMBAI - MAY 2017

On May 13, 2017, MOHAN Foundation along with Indian Society of Critical Care Medicine co-hosted the Fortis Organ Retrieval & Transplant (FORT) workshop named "A Critical Care Workshop on Declaration of brain death and donor optimization" at Fortis Hospital Mulund, Mumbai.

The faculty enlightened the participants on the Role of critical care teams in organ donation and importance of early identification of brain death, Brain death certification protocols, Difficulties in brain testing, donor optimization, Importance of involving all stakeholders in organ donation, Progress of donation in Maharashtra, Grief counselling of family, Concept of Donation after Cardiac Death (DCD) and Brain death in children. The programme also included a panel discussion on Brain Death: Unified diagnosis of death, documentation, legal aspects, conflicts as well as a position Guidelines for Donor paper on Maintenance in Hospitals was launched at the event.



SUMMIT ON ORGAN DONATION & TRANSPLANTATION IN CHILDREN IN PARTNERSHIP - DELHI - JULY 2017

On July 29, 2017 Fortis Organ Retrieval & Transplant & Department of Pediatrics, Fortis Memorial Research Institute, Gurugram in collaboration with MOHAN Foundation under the aegis of National Organ & Tissue Transplant Organization organized a Summit on Organ Donation and Transplantation in Children at Meditorium, FMRI, Gurugram. Doctors from Spain, UK, USA, Australia and India came together in India's first Organ Donation & Transplantation Summit in Children and discussed ways to take it forward.

Mr. Adrian Gutierrez Science & Technology Counsellor, Embassy of Spain in his address spoke about the recent MoU that India has signed with Spain for cooperation in the fields of organ & tissue retrieval, procurement & management.

Dr. Sunil Shroff, Managing Trustee, MOHAN Foundation gave an overview of the THO Act and gave recommendations to overcome the shortcomings regarding brain death assessment in children and inclusion of ancillary tests. Ms. Sujatha Suriyamoorthi, Manager - Information Systems made a lucid and comprehensive presentation on Pediatric organ donors: challenges in counselling. She emphasised that counselling families was not an isolated event and that every member of the health care team had a role to play in providing care for the patient and family.

CONSULTATIVE MEETING TO CREATE ORGAN DONATION CHAMPIONS IN ICUS IN INDIAN HOSPITALS – CHENNAI - NOVEMBER 2017

On November 4, 2017 MOHAN Foundation hosted a consultative meeting for a select group of intensive care specialists from across the country. The aim was to brainstorm on how to create a platform to impart effective training to ICU staff on brain death and organ donation. The meeting was held at The Pride Hotel.

Close to 15 senior intensive care specialists participated in the meeting from Chennai, Delhi, Kolkata, Bhubaneswar, Mumbai, Hyderabad and Ahmedabad.

The workshop began with Dr. Sunil Shroff addressing the group and giving them a brief overview of deceased organ donation and transplantation in India. He then explained that the workshop would train ICU doctors and staff about the key issues related to organ donation. The focus areas would be:

- Brain Death certification
- Brain Death maintenance
- Family conversation & counseling on organ donation
- Handling medico legal cases









HIGHLIGHTS – NATIONAL

ORGAN PROCUREMENT AND TRANSPLANTATION COURSE (OPAT 2018) SUCCESSFULLY HELD IN COIMBATORE

The second Organ Procurement and Transplantation Course (OPAT) 2018 was conducted on March 30th and 31st, 2018 by the Department of Hepatobiliary and Pancreatic (HPB) Surgery & Multiorgan Transplantation, PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research (PSGIMSR) in Coimbatore in association with the Indian Society of Organ Transplantation (ISOT), MOHAN Foundation and Transplant Authority of Tamil Nadu (TRANSTAN).

This was an ISOT approved hands-on training course for liver and kidney procurement on a live porcine model. In addition, the participants had undergone the Dutch Transplant Society and European Society of Organ Transplantation (ESOT) approved online course on organ procurement and back benching.16 participants attended OPAT 2018. Dr. Sumana Navin, Course Director and Ms. Sujatha Suriyamoorthi, MIS & Programme Manager, MOHAN Foundation were on the faculty for OPAT 2018 and also observed the organ procurement in the Animal Labs.

International faculty member Dr. Gabriel Oniscu, Consultant, Multi-organ Transplantation, Royal Infirmary, Edinburgh, UK spoke about 'Pancreas Retrieval and Back Bench' as well as 'Novel Approaches to Organ Preservation and Perfusion'.

The feedback from the participants was that the multi-organ retrieval on the live porcine model was an excellent learning experience. They also received a book on 'Abdominal Organ Retrieval and Transplantation Bench Surgery' edited by Dr. Gabriel Oniscu.

At the "OPAT 2018" Award ceremony and felicitation, Dr. C. Vijaya Baskar, Minister for Health and Family Welfare, Mr. S. P. Velumani, Minister for Municipal Administration and Rural Development, Government of Tamil Nadu, and Dr. P. Balaji, Member Secretary, TRANSTAN felicitated the families of deceased donors from Coimbatore. MOHAN FOUNDATION INVITED TO 3RD NATIONAL CONVENTION & SCIENTIFIC SEMINAR ON ORGAN TRANSPLANTATION IN DHAKA, BANGLADESH - MAY 2017

On May 13, 2017, MOHAN Foundation along with Indian Society of Critical Care Medicine co-hosted the Fortis Organ Retrieval & Transplant (FORT) workshop named "A Critical Care Workshop on Declaration of brain death and donor optimization" at Fortis Hospital Mulund, Mumbai.

The faculty enlightened the participants on the Role of critical care teams in organ donation and importance of early identification of brain death, Brain death certification protocols, Difficulties in brain death testing, donor optimization, Importance of involving all stakeholders in organ donation, Progress of organ donation in Maharashtra, Grief counselling of family, Concept of Donation after Cardiac Death (DCD) and Brain death in children. The programme also included a panel discussion on Brain Death: Unified diagnosis of death, documentation, legal aspects, conflicts as well as a position paper on Guidelines for Donor Maintenance in Hospitals was launched at the event.

ISODP aims to make organs and tissues donation more simple and find ways to make quality organs and tissues available for needy patients.
