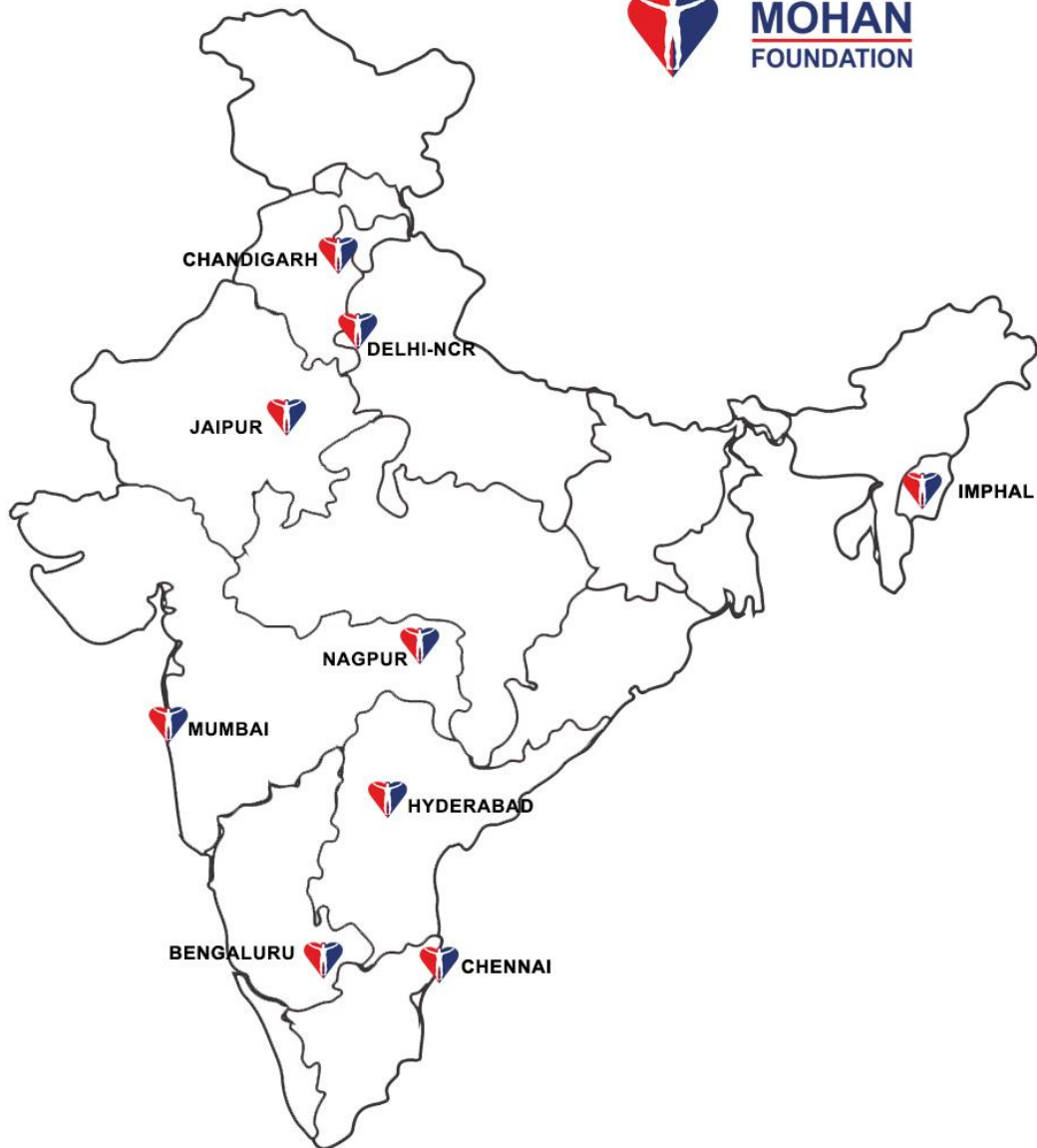

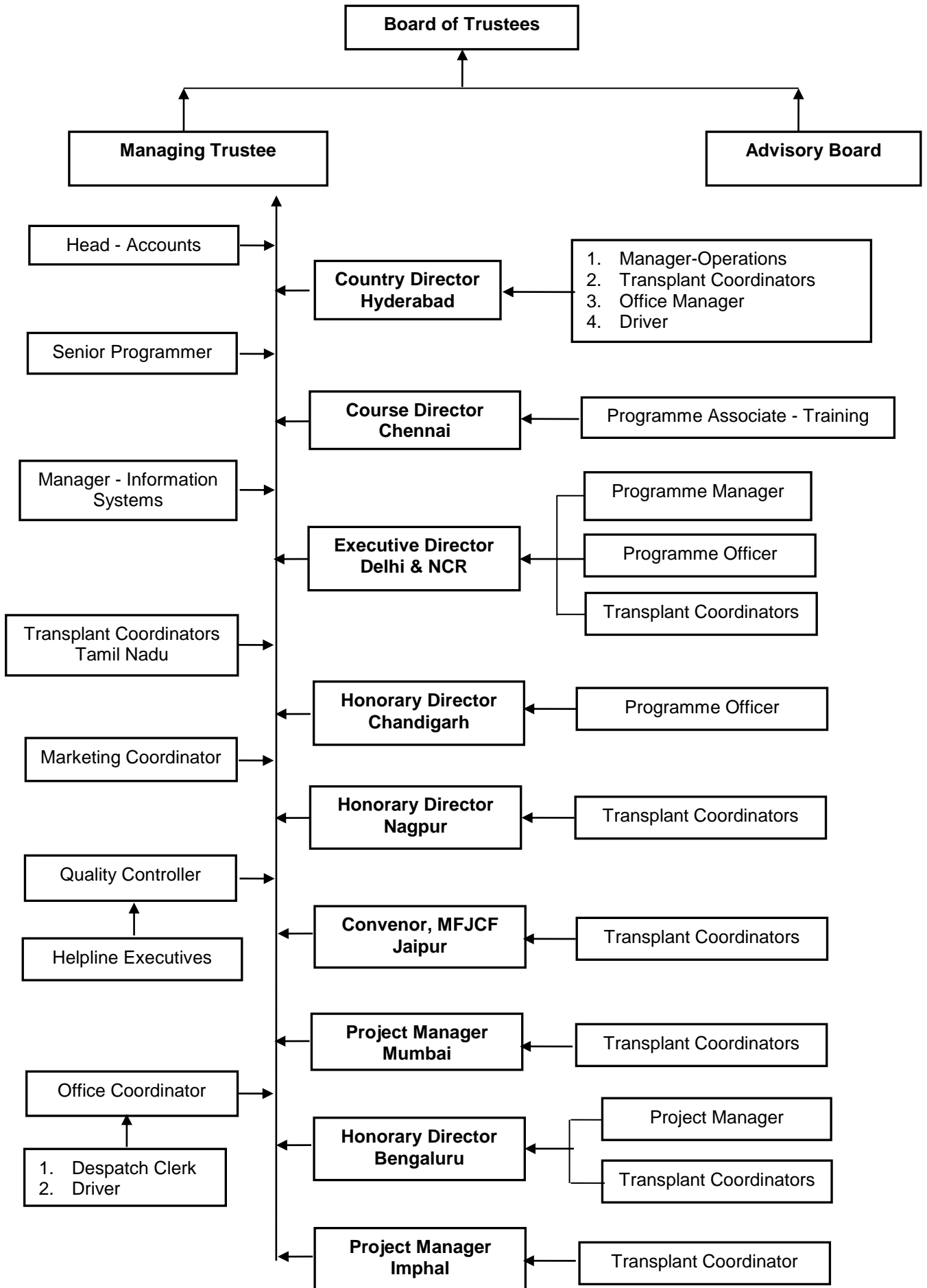

ABOUT MOHAN FOUNDATION

Introduction

MOHAN is an acronym for Multi Organ Harvesting Aid Network and was established in 1997. It is a not-for-profit, non-governmental organization started to promote organ donation. It is registered as a Trust vide Register No. 285 of 98 dated 4th August 1997 in Tamil Nadu. It has Income Tax exemption under Section 80G and 35AC. We are approved recipients under the Foreign Contributions Regulatory Act, 1976.

History:

January 12, 1997- the day MOHAN Foundation started its journey in Chennai to give patients with organ failure a new lease of life. Organ donation and transplantation has made it possible for people with organ failure to look forward to a brighter tomorrow filled with hope and promise. It is the brainchild of a group of highly motivated, concerned and non-commercial group of practicing medical professionals and non-medical professionals to promote the cause of "Organ Donation". The Foundation works to increase the reach of the Transplantation of Human Organs Act, which was passed by the Government of India in 1994 to broaden the concept of organ donation and stop commercial dealings in organs, especially kidneys.

The Foundation has offices in Chennai (H.Q), Hyderabad, Delhi-NCR, Bengaluru, Jaipur, Mumbai, Chandigarh, Nagpur, Bengaluru, Imphal and USA. MOHAN Foundation has embarked upon yet another major milestone with the creation of MOHAN USA in 2011.

- To ensure that no Indian dies for want of an organ

Mission:

- To ensure that every Indian that is suffering from end-stage organ failure be provided with the gift of a "New lease of Life", through a lifesaving organ transplant.

Objectives:

- To promote public education programs so that a cross section of our population is aware about the need to donate one's organs
- To create a network of hospitals that can be a source of organ donations
- To liaise with the Government of India and State Government to pass favourable legislations that will augment organ donations
- To network with organ donation agencies so that no organ is ever wasted
- To train health care professionals in transplant coordination, so that they may efficiently and effectively counsel the families of "brain dead" victims to donate their loved ones' organs
- To raise resources to support organ donation related activities

1. PUBLIC EDUCATION

MOHAN Foundation regularly organises awareness events to a cross section of population. Over 2.5 million donor cards have been distributed in English, Tamil, Telugu, Marathi and Hindi. The Foundation also has literature on organ donation and prevention of different diseases.

Public Education Programs across the country

Educating the public about organ donation has been our constant endeavour for the last 22 years. This is done through awareness programs, information stalls, distributing public IEC (Information, Education and Communication) materials and organ donor cards, creating awareness through press and media and by regularly doing public functions with themes related to organ donation.



April 2018 - Mumbai to London for a Good Cause - 'Road trip for Organ Donation'

Mr. & Mrs. Bhal Shekhar Chilana, this couple's road trip from Mumbai to London, across 14 countries, covering 22000 Kms in 60 days has a very special meaning. Mr. Chilana's daughter who lives in the UK, was diagnosed with end-stage kidney failure a few years ago and in 2017, she received her life saving kidney transplant. This personal experience, made Mr. Chilana to get involved in spreading awareness on organ donation so that many lives like his daughter could be saved.

November 2018 -Tamil Nadu's first Visual Arts Festival on Organ Donation

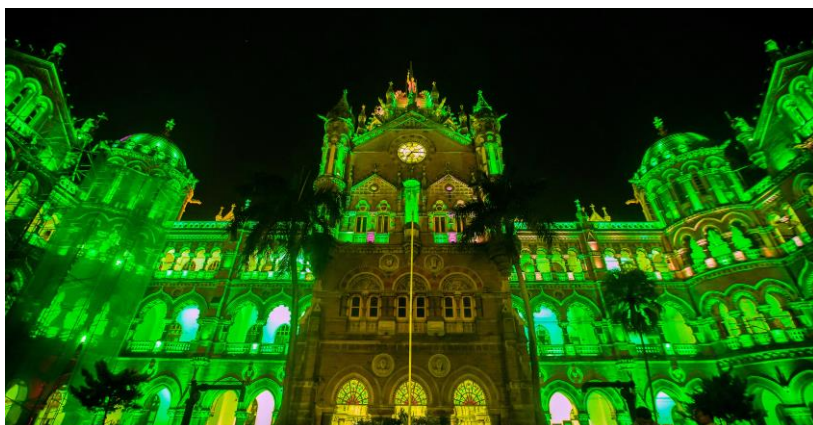
MOHAN Foundation, in association with Chennai Metro Rail Limited had organised a first of its kind Visual Arts Competition in Tamil Nadu, 'LIFE 2.0' on 24th November 2018 at Vadapalani Metro Station.

About 200 students from various schools creatively used various art forms like paintings, graphics and installations to promote the cause of organ donation. At the event, the Foundation showcased an exhibition titled "Life before Ashes" featuring human organ installations made from a mix of real human ashes and mud. Also featured was an exhibition titled "Nafas" that had travelled all the way from Iran. Nafas (meaning "breath" in Persian) was the first visual arts festival on the topic of Organ Donation held by Iranian Society of Organ Donation with Iranian Artists' Forum. Mr. S. Pandiyan, PRO, Chennai Metro Rail Limited graced the occasion and distributed prizes along with the judges.





November 2018 - Mumbai CST bathed in Green: A Tribute to Organ Donors and their Families on National Organ Donation Day



The iconic century-old Chhatrapati Shivaji Terminus Mumbai (CSTM) railway station, was illuminated in Bright Green on 27th November 2018, India's National Organ Donation day, to promote the cause of organ donation. It symbolises hope for all those waiting for a second chance at life through transplantation. It reminds us of the men, women and children who have died waiting for a life-saving organ. Most importantly, it conveys our gratitude to Organ Donors and their families for giving the supreme gift of all – the gift of life.

An information booth was also setup by MOHAN Foundation for two days, inside the station that is a UNESCO World heritage site and sees an average footfall of around 6.3 lakh passengers per day.

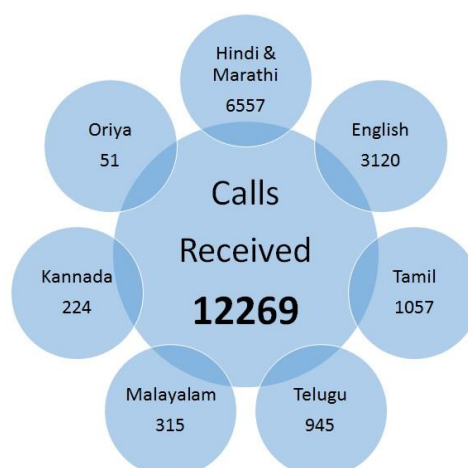

EDUCATIVE PROGRAMS FOR POLICE PERSONNEL

The police play an integral role in deceased organ and tissue donation (medico-legal cases). An initiative to educate them on their role in facilitating multi-organ donation was initiated by MOHAN Foundation. **27 such programs were conducted as a result of which 1166 police personnel were educated across the country.**



2. PUBLICATIONS

(i) Indian Transplant Newsletter (ITN) -

The Indian Transplant Newsletter is being published since 1998 and is currently in its 55th issue. It carries national and international transplant news and keeps track of the Indian deceased donor organ transplant program. The executive committee has doctors from the transplant field from all over the country and abroad.

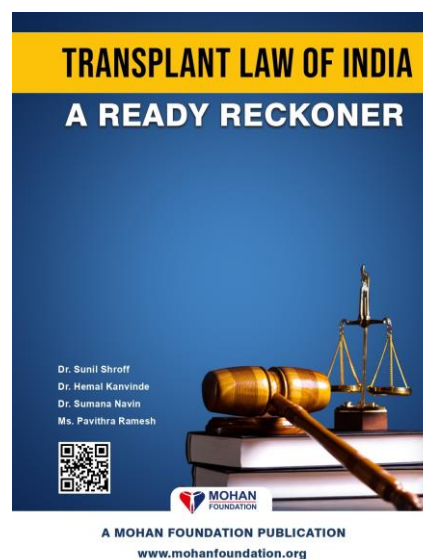
About 1000 copies of the newsletter are dispatched every quarter to transplant clinicians and members of the public in India and abroad.

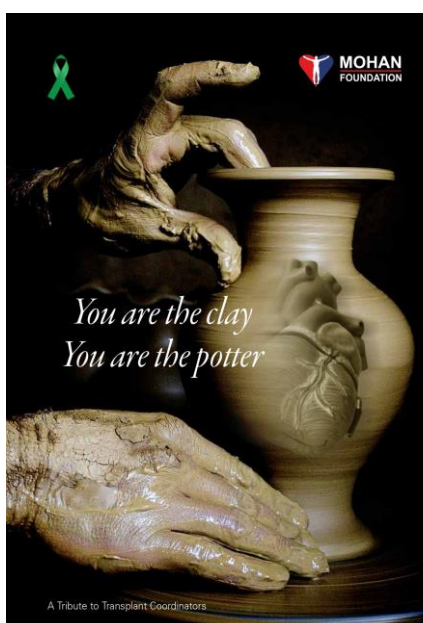

3. TRAINING PROGRAMS

3.1 TRANSPLANT COORDINATORS' TRAINING PROGRAM

Transplant coordinators play a pivotal role in the success of the organ donation and transplantation program. The Government of India in its recent amendment entitled "The Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Act, 2011" has made transplant coordinators' nomination mandatory before a hospital is registered as a transplant hospital.

To address the training needs of this cadre of health care professionals, MOHAN Foundation started a structured "Transplant Coordinators' Training Program" in the year 2009. Depending on the requirement of the candidates it runs courses of various durations from one week to one year.



From April 2018 to March 2019, 8 one week and 1 one-month transplant coordinators' training programs were conducted through which 343 candidates were trained across the country. These training programs were conducted under the aegis of **NOTTO and different ROTTOS and SOTTOs**.

The transplant coordinators' training program is part funded by the Tata Trusts

DELHI-NCR: APRIL 2018

MOHAN Foundation in partnership with FORT (Fortis Organ Retrieval & Transplant) under the aegis of NOTTO (National Organ & Tissue Transplant Organization) successfully completed the "Transplant Coordinators' Training Programme" from 3rd to 7th April, 2018. 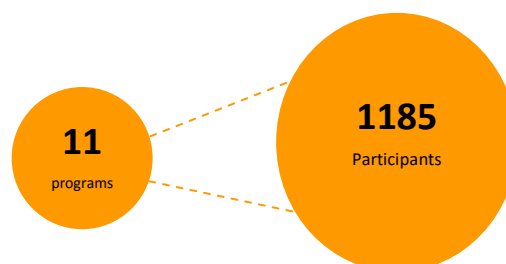

MOHAN FOUNDATION PARTICIPATES IN THE 2ND YEAR OF MINI FELLOWSHIP IN ORGAN DONATION AT GIFT OF LIFE INSTITUTE, PHILADELPHIA, USA

Ms Pallavi Kumar, Executive Director (MF) and Ms Arati Gokhale, Central Coordinator, ZTCC (Zonal Transplant Coordination Centre) Pune underwent Gift of Life Institute's (GOLI) Mini Fellowship in Organ Donation from October 15-26, 2018 in USA. This fellowship was facilitated under the auspices of the International Cooperation Agreement signed between Gift of Life Institute, Philadelphia and MOHAN Foundation in 2015. One of the objectives of the agreement was facilitating the enhancement of the deceased donation and transplantation program in India through education and training of donation and transplantation professionals in the country. The Mini Fellowship was sponsored through an educational grant from MOHAN, USA, Inc. which is a 501(c) (3) registered non-profit organization that was formed to increase awareness about organ shortage and promote transparency and ethical organ transplantation in India and the rest of the world (www.mohanusa.org)

Gift of Life Donor Program, Philadelphia is the largest non-profit Organ Procurement Organization (OPO) in USA that serves eastern Pennsylvania, southern New Jersey and Delaware. It facilitated 565 organ donations in 2017 that resulted in 1,546 transplants (50 donors per million population) – the highest volume in the U.S.

MOHAN FOUNDATION INVITED TO THE 1ST REGIONAL MEETING OF THE TRANSPLANTATION SOCIETY - ISTANBUL, TURKEY - MARCH 2019

The 1st Regional Meeting of The Transplantation Society (TTS) was held on 28th & 29th March 2019 in Istanbul, Turkey. The theme of the meeting was “Deceased Donation: Expanding the Donor Pool.” The meeting aimed at providing insights into the medical, legislative, ethical, cultural, and social hurdles that needed to be overcome to increase deceased donation rates in the Middle East, Africa, and Mid Asia as well as the world. Dr. Sunil Shroff, Managing Trustee and Dr. Sumana Navin, Course Director, MOHAN Foundation were invited to attend the meeting by Dr. Riadh Fadhil on behalf of The Doha International Academy of Organ Donation - Hamad Medical Corporation, Doha, Qatar.

The Doha International Academy of Organ Donation sponsored a symposium entitled “Regional Legal, Ethical, and Religious Challenges of Deceased Organ Donation Programme” at the meeting. Dr. Riadh Fadhil said that the symposium was the first activity of the Reach Out for Organ Transplantation Self-sufficiency (ROOTS) programme – a new Qatari collaborative initiative to develop or improve organ donation programmes in the developing countries and Qatar.
