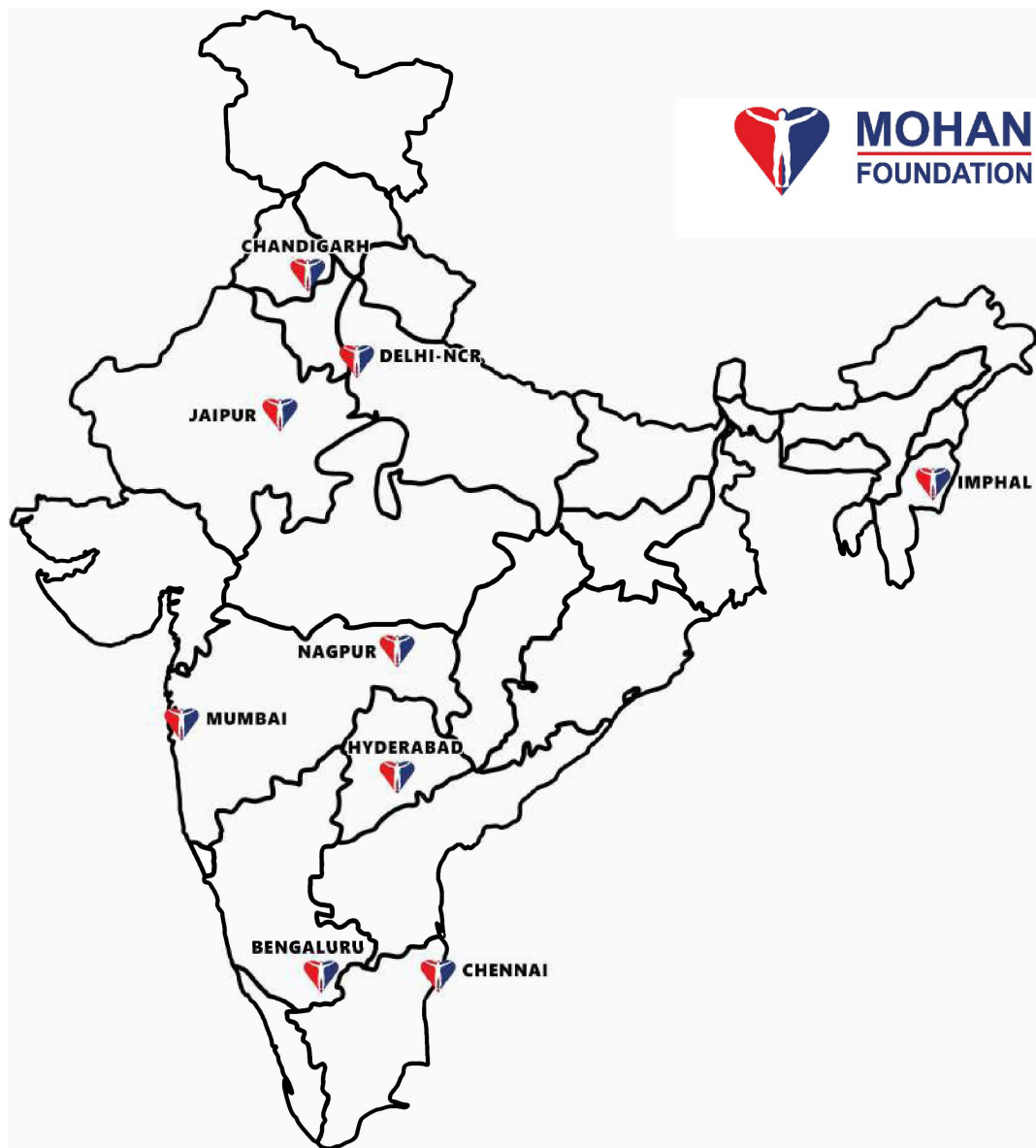

ABOUT MOHAN FOUNDATION

MOHAN is an acronym for Multi Organ Harvesting Aid Network and was established in 1997. It is a not-for-profit, non-governmental organization started to promote organ donation. It is registered as a Trust vide Register No. 285 of 98 dated 4th August 1997 in Tamil Nadu. It has Income Tax exemption under Section 80G and 35AC. It is an approved recipient under the Foreign Contributions Regulatory Act, 1976.

HISTORY

January 12, 1997- the day MOHAN Foundation started its journey in Chennai to give patients with organ failure a new lease of life. Organ donation and transplantation has made it possible for people with organ failure to look forward to a brighter tomorrow filled with hope and promise. It is the brainchild of a group of highly motivated, concerned and non-commercial group of practicing medical professionals and non-medical professionals to promote the cause of "Organ Donation". The Foundation works to increase the reach of the Transplantation of Human Organs Act, which was passed by the Government of India in 1994 to broaden the concept of organ donation and stop commercial dealings in organs, especially kidneys.

The Foundation has offices in Chennai (H.Q), Hyderabad, Delhi-NCR, Jaipur, Mumbai, Chandigarh, Nagpur, Bengaluru and Imphal.

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MOHAN USA, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) registered non-profit organization that was formed to increase awareness about organ shortage and promote transparency and ethical organ transplantation in India and the rest of the world.

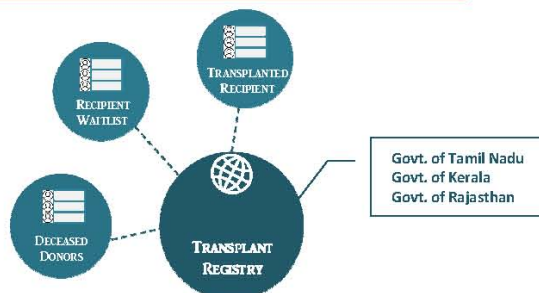

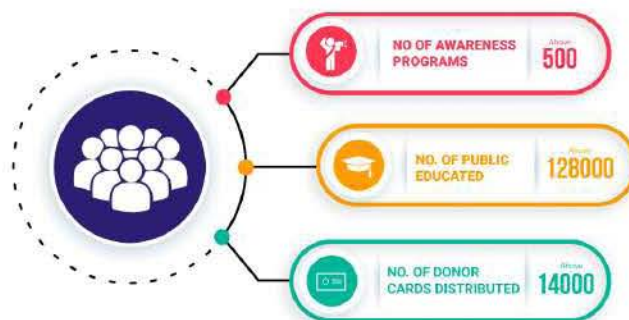

CREATING AWARENESS

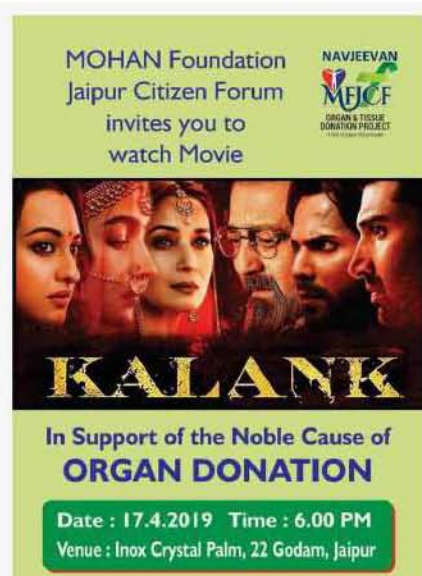

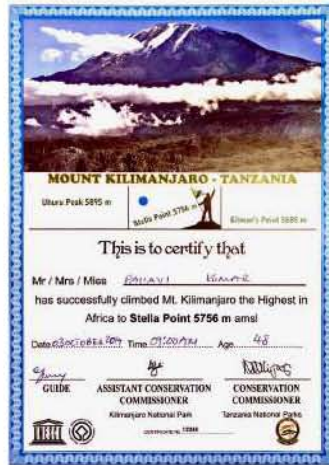

TRAINING

TRANSPLANT COORDINATORS' TRAINING PROGRAM

Transplant coordinators play a pivotal role in the success of the organ donation and transplantation program. The Government of India in its amendment entitled "The Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Act, 2011" has made transplant coordinators' nomination mandatory before a hospital is registered as a transplant hospital.

To address the training needs of this cadre of health care professionals, MOHAN Foundation started a structured "Transplant Coordinators' Training Program" (TCTP) in the year 2009.

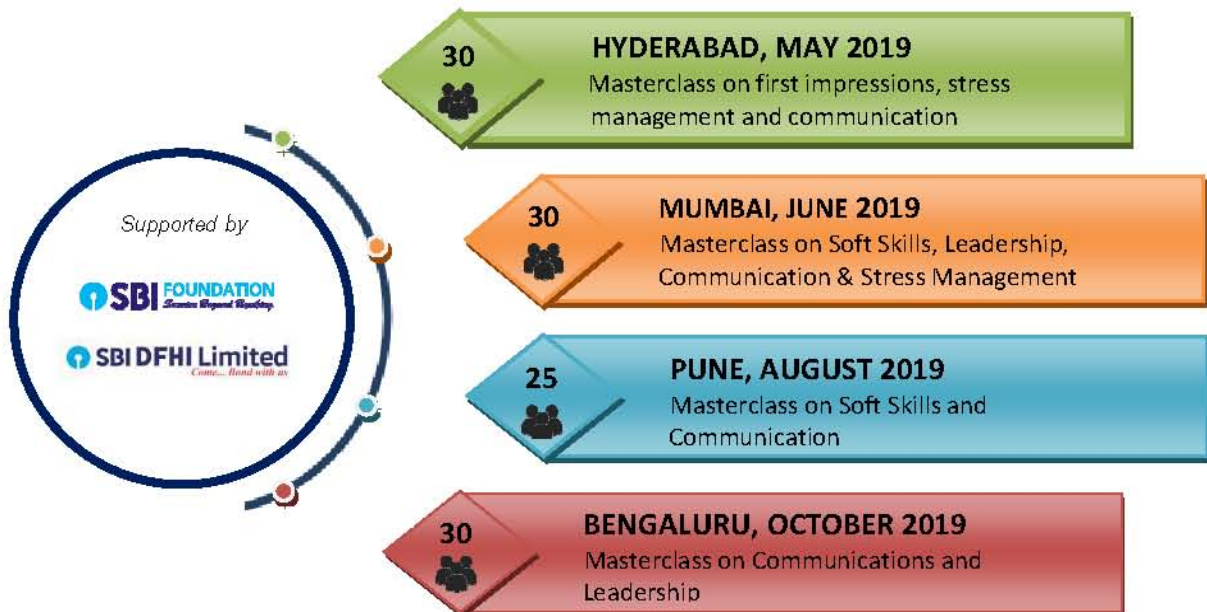

National Annual Transplant Coordinators' Conference, Ahmedabad, December 2019

MOHAN Foundation in association with the Network and Alliance of Transplant Coordinators (NATCO), and the Centre for Management of Health Services (CMHS) - Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad organized the 12th National Annual Transplant Coordinators' Conference at the IIM Ahmedabad campus on 30th November and 1st December 2019.

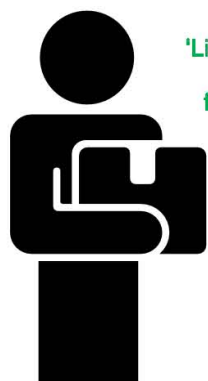

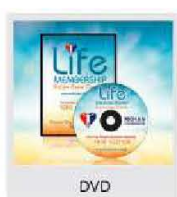
