January 12, 1997- MOHAN Foundation started its journey in Chennai to give patients with organ failure a new lease of life. Organ donation and transplantation has made it possible for people with organ failure to look forward to a brighter tomorrow filled with hope and promise. It is the brainchild of a group of highly motivated, concerned and non-commercial group of practicing medical professionals and non-medical professionals to promote the cause of "Organ Donation".

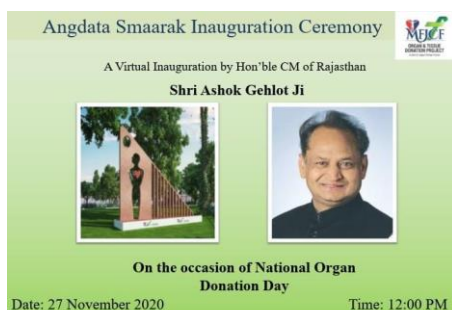
KAUN BANEGA CROREPATI (KBC) SHOW

MODULE 2: A 2-hour activity based, interactive session (virtual) with MOHAN Foundation team and other invited experts.

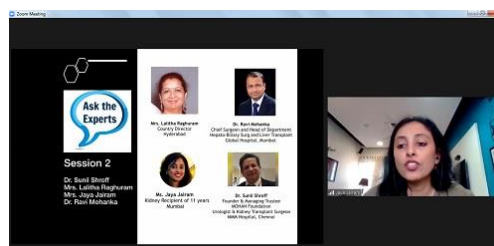

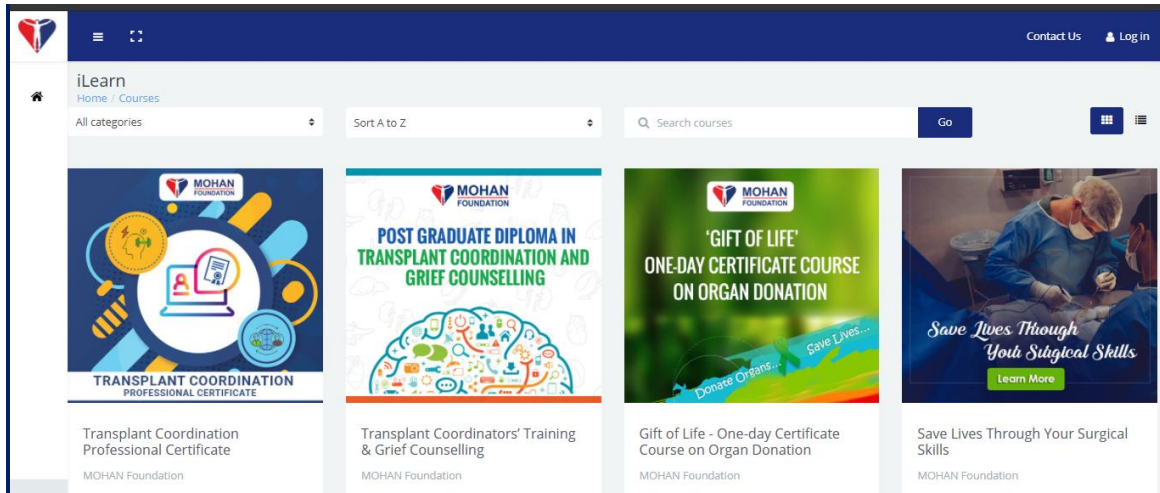

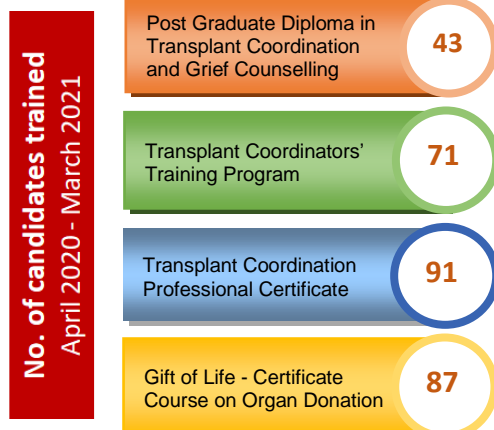

ONLINE TRAINING PROGRAMMES



Transplant Coordinators

MOHAN Foundation started a structured “Transplant Coordinators’ Training Program” in 2009. Training was conducted face-to-face with durations varying from one week to one month. Working healthcare professionals found it challenging to attend because of time constraints. In addition, participants were from different educational backgrounds and had varied skill sets and learning requirements. To meet this challenge, MOHAN Foundation embarked on an online training program and formally rolled out a one-year E-learning course, Post Graduate Diploma in Transplant Coordination and Grief Counselling, in 2017. The COVID-19 pandemic resulted in expanding the use of online training with the introduction of a short-term course, ‘Transplant Coordination Professional Certificate’.

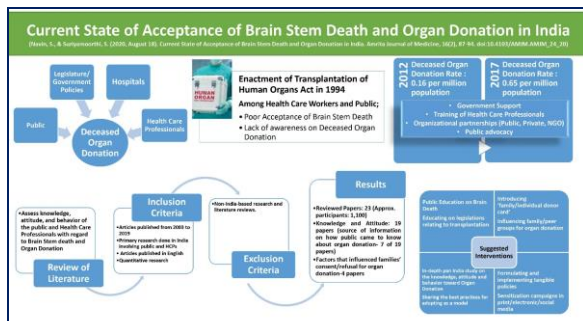

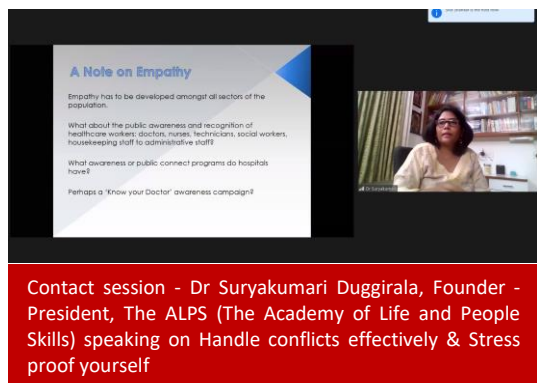
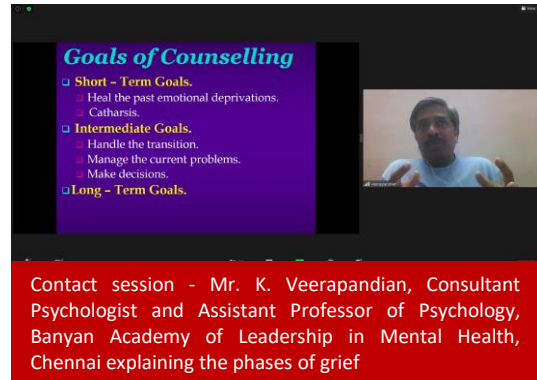

Visual abstract project submitted on Current state of acceptance of brain stem death and organ donation in India



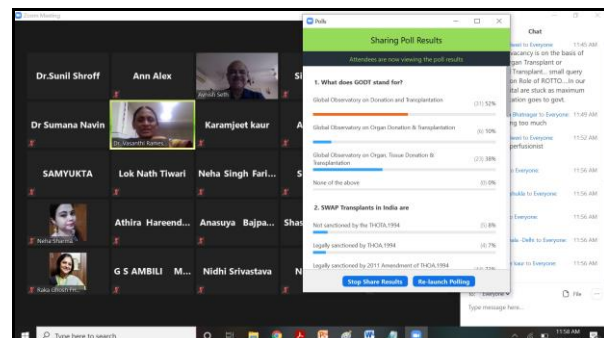
8th FORT-MOHAN Foundation one-week online training on Transplant Coordination

MOHAN Foundation in partnership with FORT (Fortis Organ Retrieval & Transplant) successfully completed the 8th FORT-MOHAN Foundation online training on Transplant Coordination held from 17th to 29th August 2020. The training was uniquely designed and organised online for the very first time. The training was held on the Zoom software platform. A total of 71 (national & international) delegates of diverse profiles attended the training.

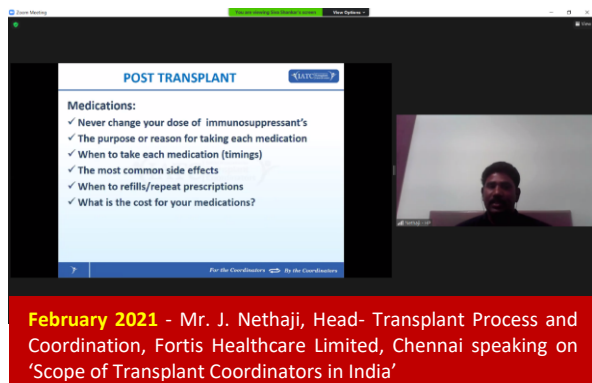


Transplant Coordination Professional Certificate

British Transplantation Society NHS Blood and Transplant Congress - February 2021



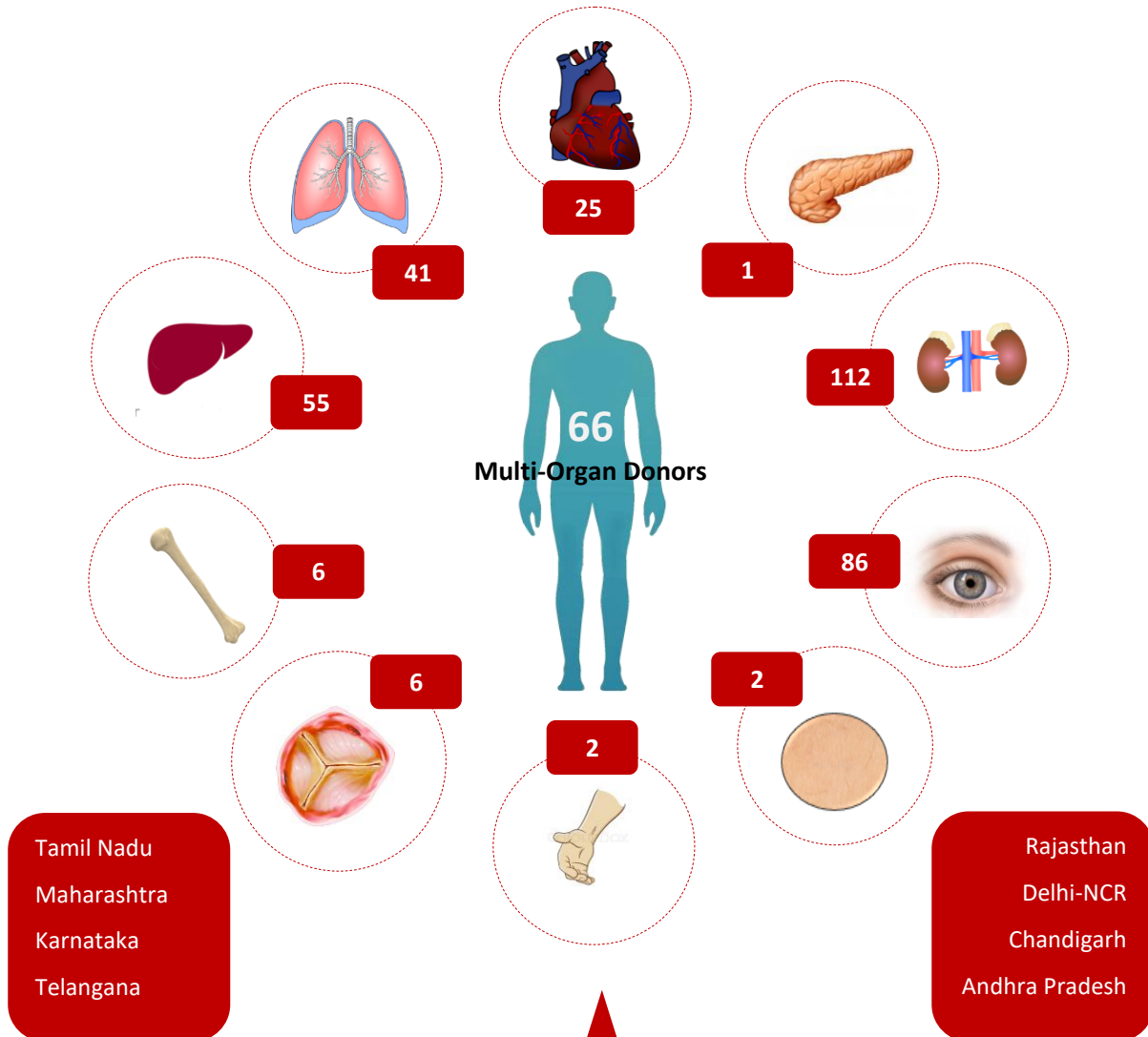

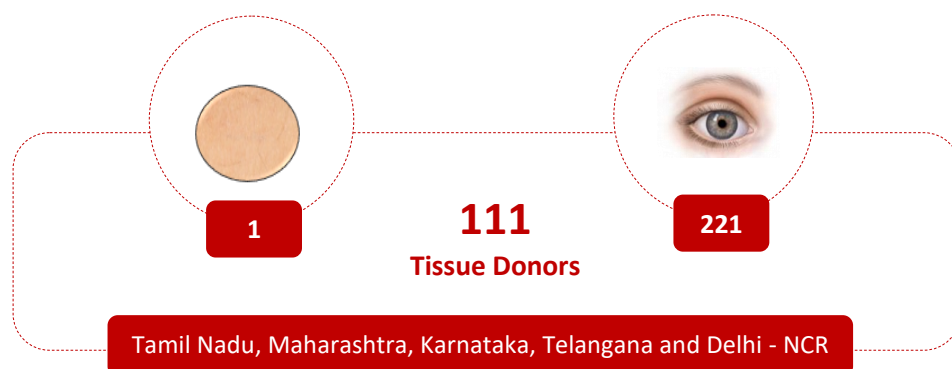

Tissue donation after circulatory death (DCD)

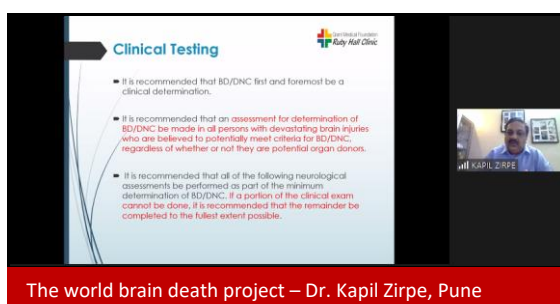


INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE OF TRANSPLANT COORDINATORS - NOVEMBER 2020

The 2020 edition of the Annual Conference of Transplant Coordinators organised by the Network & Alliance of Transplant Coordinators (NATCO) and MOHAN Foundation was an international conference and also the Pre-Conference of the 8th National Bioethics Conference of the Forum for Medical Ethics Society. It was held on 21st & 22nd November 2020 in a virtual format and consisted of key lectures on the World Brain Death Project and its application in India, Impact of COVID-19 pandemic on organ donation and transplantation, and Women in Transplants.

Transplant coordinators spoke of their experiences related to organ allocation, donations during the COVID-19 pandemic, various ways of supporting their patients to undergo transplants.

The 'Women in Transplantation' section featured Dr. Nancy Ascher, USA, Dr. Lori West, Canada, Dr. Vasanthi Ramesh and Mrs. Lalitha Raghuram from India. They spoke about not shying away from the challenges in the field of organ donation and transplantation and striving to make a difference.



SENSITISATION PROGRAMS FOR MEDICAL AND OTHER HOSPITAL STAFF



MOHAN Foundation has been regularly engaging with health personnel especially the doctors & nurses and paramedical staff and conducting sensitization programs on 'Organ donation and transplantation'. The issues related to brain death and its implications for the deceased organ donation program had been addressed during those sessions.

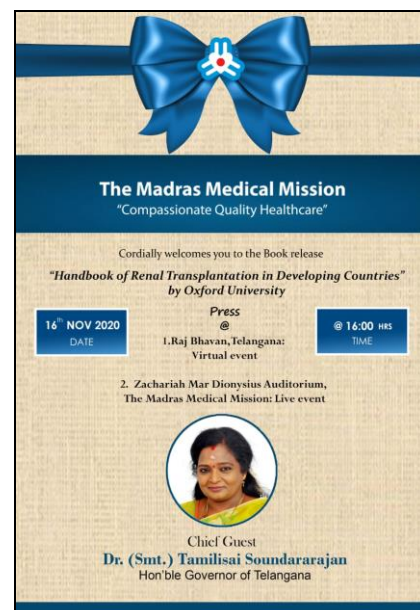

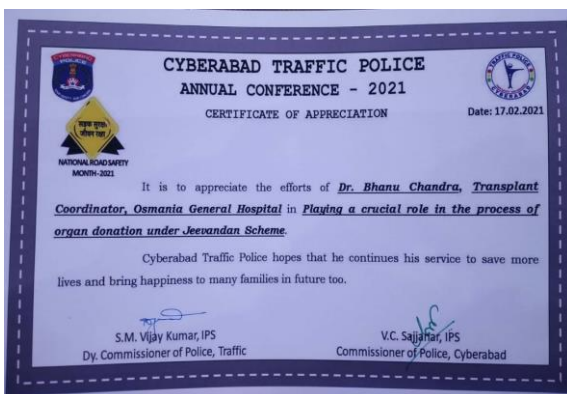
MOHAN Foundation's Transplant Coordinator Receives Appreciation Award from TRANSTAN - November 2020

Mehta, a renowned social worker, Past President of Jain Sewa Mandal, who did 115 Kanyadan of orphan girls, known for his social work, 'continued' to do so even after death as his organs were donated that would provide new lease of life to three.

Mehta was admitted in New Era Hospital six days ago. In spite of all the treatment, his condition neurologically deteriorated, and team of doctors declared him brain dead. Family members were counselled by Prarthana Dwedi.

After the counseling, wife Indumati Mehta readily agreed to donate husband's organs.

Mehta couple had already pledged for whole body donation 25 years ago, family members fulfilled his wish by donating a liver and pair of corneas that would give new lease of life to 3 people.

"My husband will continue to live in three other souls we are content with our decision to donate his organs," said Indumati Mehta. Earlier, during treatment the brain dead committee members at New Era Hospital Dr Nilesh Agrawal-Neurosurgeon, Dr Parag Moon-Neurophysician, Dr Amol Kokas-Intensivist and Dr Sahil Bansal-Anaesthetist declared Mehta brain dead.

Mehta family gave consent for donating two kidneys, liver and pair of corneas. Accordingly Zonal Transplant Coordination Committee (ZTCC) was contacted. The committee headed by President Dr Vibhavari Danti and Secretary Dr Sanjay Kolte allocated organs by waiting list. Zone coordinator Veena Wathore assisted them.

Liver was given to New Era Hospital (43-year-old man), ZTCC-Vice President and Kidney Committee Chairman Dr Vireesh Gupta declared after medical assessment, that both kidneys were not suitable for transplant so not retrieved. Pair of Corneas was donated to Mahatma Eye Bank. New Era hospital team did the work of retrieval and transplant. The team worked under Dr Anand Sancheti and Dr Nidheesh Mishra. Dr Rahul Saxena was the Liver Transplant surgeon, along with his team Dr Sneha Khade, Lokesh Tarare, Greta Bawankar, Archana Navghure and Shailesh Transplant coordinator Dr Ashwini Choudhary and Pallavi Jawar.



TRIOMPH has initiated discussions with Health Insurance companies for providing Health cover to Live donors and Transplant Recipients. Presently, health insurance is not available to this category of public.

Anudaan - Making Transplants Affordable, an initiative aimed at helping underprivileged patients undergo transplant

Organ donations are increasingly saving lives and organs are being transplanted across gender, caste and religious identities in many states of India. These acts of solidarity and generosity are something to celebrate. However, there is a spoiler in this inspiring tale.

Organ transplants in India are prohibitively expensive. A huge number of organ failure patients are not benefiting from this life-saving procedure advancement in medicine. They are ill-equipped to bear the financial burden of the transplant and subsequent follow-ups and therefore cannot avail this option.

There are very few public hospitals performing transplants. More than 95% of organ transplants especially of organs like livers and hearts are currently performed in the private sector where costs range from Rs. 20 to 25 lakhs. Even relatively less complex kidney transplants cost between Rs. 8 to 10 lakhs.

Like in many other spheres, the poor by the accident of their birth stand little chance of receiving life-saving transplants.

More State Governments need to pave the way for making transplants affordable and help patients with post-transplant medication support. Till then, NGOs and such entities need to come forward to bridge the gap.

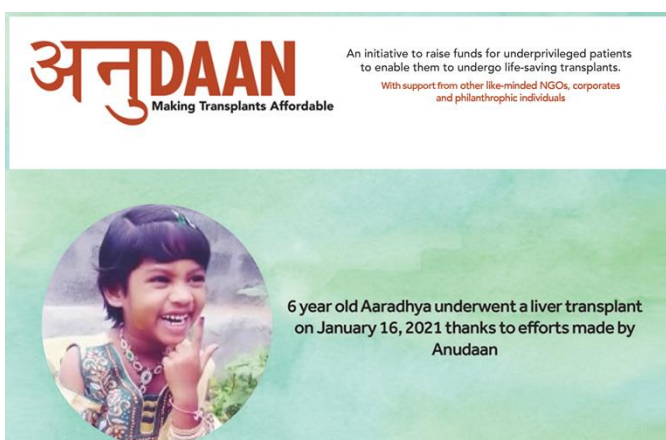

Story of Aaradhya (6 years), a liver transplant recipient



Baby Aaradhya hails from a low-income family that could never afford such an expensive transplant without the support provided by 'Anudaan'.

While Aaradhya's mother was willing to give a portion of her liver, the family was lacking the financial resources to go ahead. We received support of many individuals and 'Transplants Help the Poor Foundation' and we were able to collectively raise Rs. 8.5 Lakhs. The hospital gave some concession and the transplant was made possible. On 16th January, 2021, Aaradhya successfully underwent a liver transplant at Global Hospitals, Hyderabad.

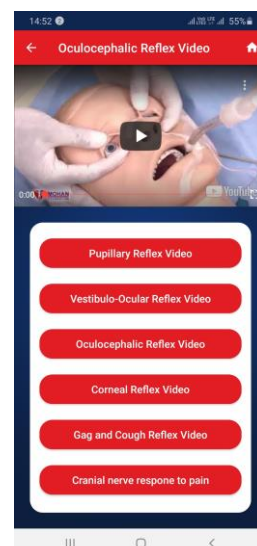
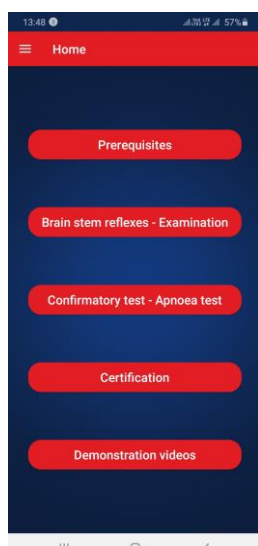

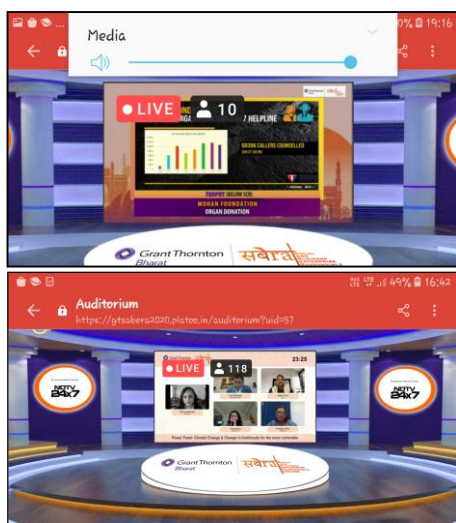
