It is registered as a Trust vide Register No. 285 of 98 dated 4th August 1997 in Tamil Nadu and has Income Tax exemption under Section 80G. It is an approved recipient under the Foreign Contributions Regulatory Act, 1976

HISTORY

January 12, 1997 - MOHAN Foundation started its journey in Chennai to give patients with organ failure a new lease of life. Organ donation and transplantation has made it possible for people with organ failure to look forward to a brighter tomorrow filled with hope and promise. It is the brainchild of a group of highly motivated, concerned and non-commercial group of practicing medical professionals and non-medical professionals to promote the cause of "Organ Donation".

Celebration of Organ Donation Week

All the offices of MOHAN Foundation observed Organ Donation Week from August 7 - 13, 2021. Multiple awareness talks, online sessions, stalls, information desks, rangoli competition, photography competition were organised to reach out to maximum number of people so that everyone is sensitised about organ donation, its need and more people can come forward and pledge their organs.

Photography Competition



MFJCF, in partnership with Nevania Arts, organised a photography competition on the theme of 'Angdaan and Recycle Life.' A total of 40 photographs were received, from which the judges selected the best three entries and announced the winners on July 4, 2021.

Rangoli Competition



The 3rd edition of Rangoli Competition with the theme of Organ Donation 'Azhiyadha Kolangal III', in collaboration with Chennai Metro Rail was held online in March 2022.

Around 263 participants registered (152 teams). Overall 102 designs were submitted from Tamil Nadu, Odisha, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Punjab Telangana and other states. Ten best submissions were invited for a zoom based interactions for the finals held on March 10, 2022, the World Kidney Day.

Celebration of Life - A Virtual Concert by Padma Shri Usha Uthup in aid of Organ Donation

MOHAN USA, organised a virtual concert on the evening of 31st December 2021 by Padma Shri Smt. Usha Uthup to support the cause of organ donation and the work undertaken by MOHAN Foundation.

Smt. Usha Uthup enthralled the audience with a variety of songs in different languages and also spoke about organ donation and appealed to the audience to pledge to donate organs and save as many lives as possible.



The concert was streamed live on MOHAN Foundation's YouTube and Facebook. There were 534 views on YouTube and 376 views on Facebook. This event was held in partnership with Indian Fine Arts Academy of San Diego (IFAASD) and MOHAN Foundation - Jaipur Citizen Forum (MFJCF). The financial donors were thanked for their generosity. This generosity comes as a shot in the arm for our life saving work.

Organ transplant costs are exorbitant and not many government hospitals perform transplants. As a result, many poor are unable to avail this advancement of medicine. Through this concert, we urged the audience to join hands with us and contribute to MOHAN Foundation's initiative - "Anudaan - Making Transplants Affordable" to save the lives of patients with end stage organ failure. The event reached 1308 views in Facebook and 163 views in YouTube.

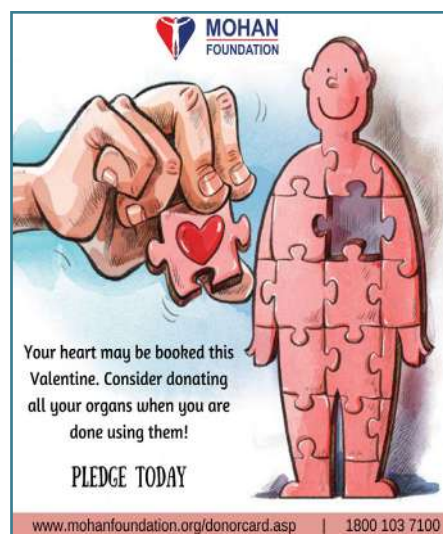

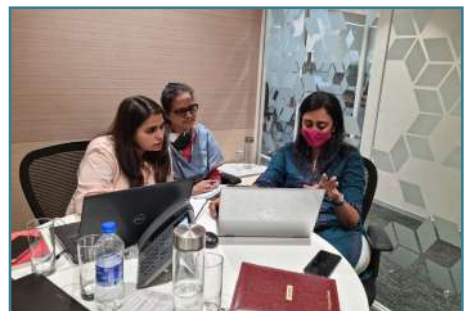

Training Programmes for Transplant Coordinators

The Transplantation of Human Organs (Amendment) Act, 2011, has made Transplant Coordinator nomination mandatory for a hospital to register as a transplant center. To address the training needs of this cadre of health-care professionals, MOHAN Foundation started the "Transplant Coordinators' Training Programme" in 2009, the first of its kind structured course in South Asia.

Face-to-Face One-Week Transplant Coordinators' Training Programme

Chennai - March 21 - 25, 2022



The one-week face-to-face Transplant Coordinators' Training Programme was attended by a total of 22 participants from different parts of the country - Tamil Nadu, Puducherry, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Rajasthan. The participants were from varied backgrounds such as nursing, social work, hospital administration, dialysis technology and physician assistant. The training programme concluded successfully with a valedictory function. Dr Amalorpavanathan J, Former Convenor - Transplant Authority of Tamil Nadu (TRANSTAN) graced the occasion as special guest. Rtn. Vijayagopal Reddy, Rotary Madras Southwest (RMSW) & Managing Trustee, Dodla Parthasarathy Reddy and Lalithamma Trust also joined the function as an invited guest. 'Transplant coordinators play a pivotal role in transplant programme and the success of this programme lies on effective coordination and counselling', said Dr Amalorpavanathan J.

Delhi-NCR - March 22 - 26, 2022

MOHAN Foundation in partnership with MOST (Manipal Organ Sharing & Transplant) conducted a training programme on Transplant Coordination from March 22 to March 26, 2022 under the aegis of National Organ & Tissue Transplant Organization (NOTTO). The training drew 35 delegates from 7 states: Haryana, Rajasthan, Delhi, Manipur, Gujarat, Sikkim and Uttar Pradesh. They included transplant coordinators, nurses, managers, medical, senior executive, nurse educator, associate consultant, medical officer, marketing executive, and counsellors.

On the last day of the training, a panel discussion and an open house were organised to address the participants' questions. Dr Harsha Jauhari (Senior Consultant, Department of Renal Transplant Surgery, Sir Ganga Ram Hospital), Ms Lalitha Raghuram (Country Director, MOHAN Foundation), Dr (Lt Gen) CS Narayanan (Head, Neurology, MHD), Dr Archana Kumari (Consultant Coordination, NOTTO), Dr Anurag Saxena (Head, Neurosurgery, MHD), Dr Srikanth Srinivasan (Head, Critical Care, MHD), and Ms Nomita Sarkar (Head, Nursing, MHD) were among the panelists. The panel discussion was moderated by Dr (Col) Avnish Seth (MOST) and Ms Pallavi Kumar (Executive Director, MOHAN Foundation).

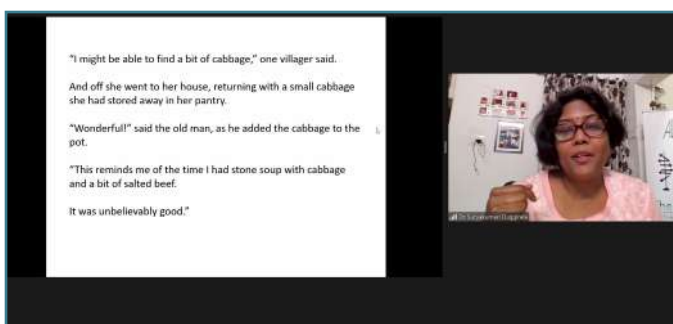

Family Counselling and Conversations on Organ Donation



A 15-hour online course “Family counselling and conversations on organ donation” was introduced by MOHAN Foundation in December 2021. This course helps the learners not only to understand emotionally intensive conversations with grieving families but also equips them to offer the option of organ donation with sensitivity and empathy. The online modules include simulations of family conversations and case studies.

Surgical Retrieval Course On Multi - Organ Donor Procurement Surgery

Optimum organ retrieval perfusion and preservation are the basis of delivering quality organs for transplantation and have an impact on both short and long term graft outcome. Standardization of surgical techniques is important in a network that shares organs between hospitals. The certificate course will give access to the online materials and videos for a year and after successful completion of all the modules the participants will be rewarded with the certificate.



Courses for General Public

A wide range of online courses are offered for general public introducing basic concepts of organ donation and transplantation, preventing and managing organ failure. These courses are designed not only to improve the knowledge and attitude of general public towards organ donation and transplantation, but also to educate the public with authenticated information about preventing end stage organ diseases.

Gift of Life - Certificate Course on Organ Donation

This one-day course introduces basic concepts of organ donation and transplantation to improve the knowledge and attitude of general public towards organ donation and transplantation.

This is open for general public who is interested in learning more about organ donation and would like help patients suffering from end stage organ failure by spreading the noble cause.

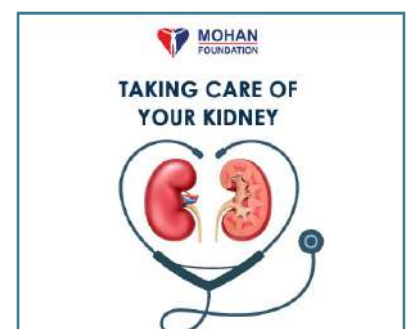

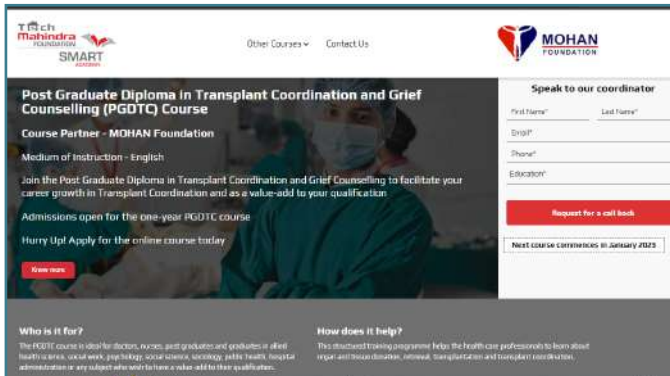

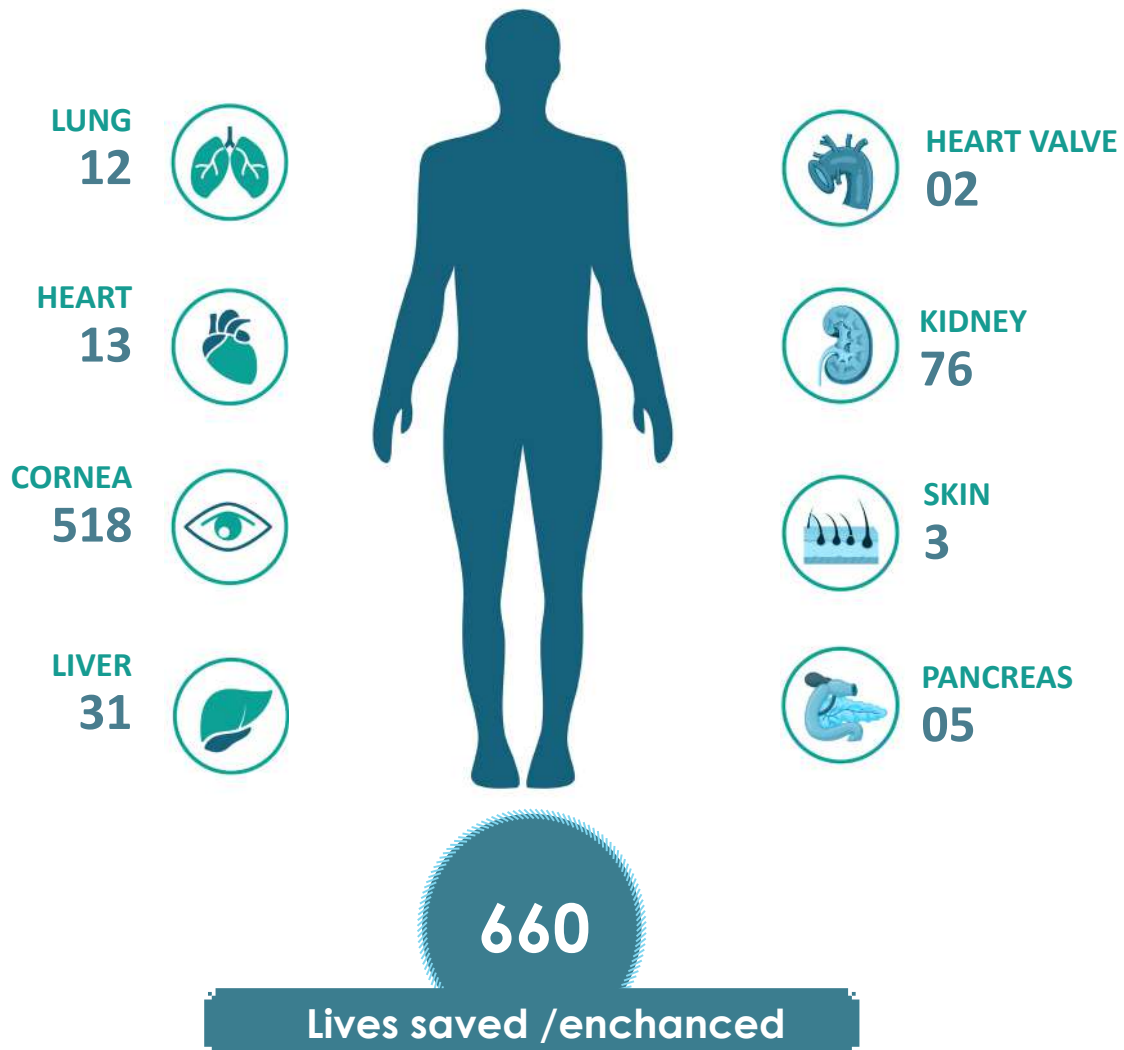


Tech Mahindra Foundation SMART Academy Launches MOHAN Foundation's Online Courses

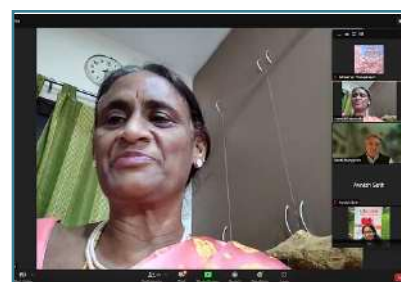

Around 100 national and international delegates including transplant coordinators, NGO representatives and individuals working towards promoting the cause attended the conference. 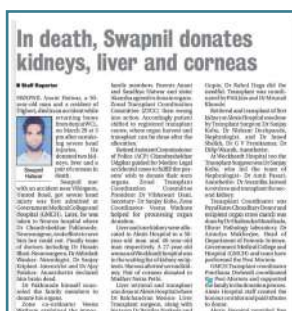
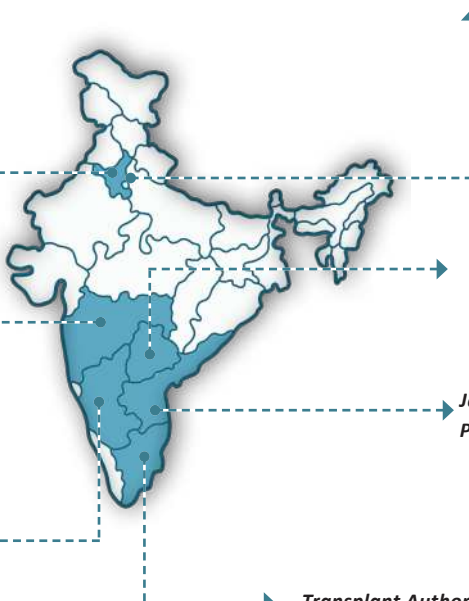

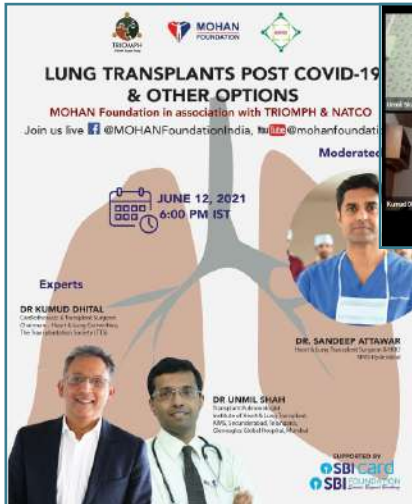
Mr Kishor Suryavanshi, a kidney transplant recipient of 14 years and a badminton player who represented India at World Transplant Games - June 2021

Mr Kishor shared about his love for cricket and other sports from a very young age and how it helped him going and cope with post-transplant issues.

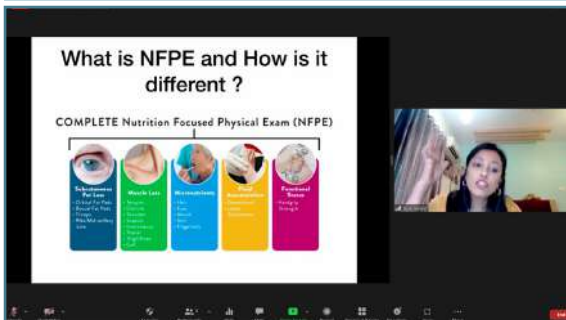

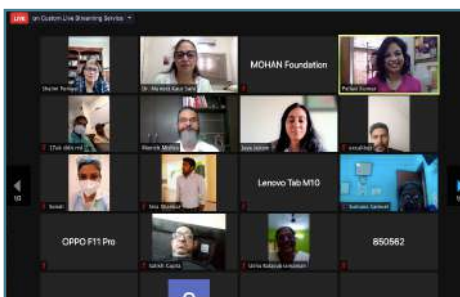

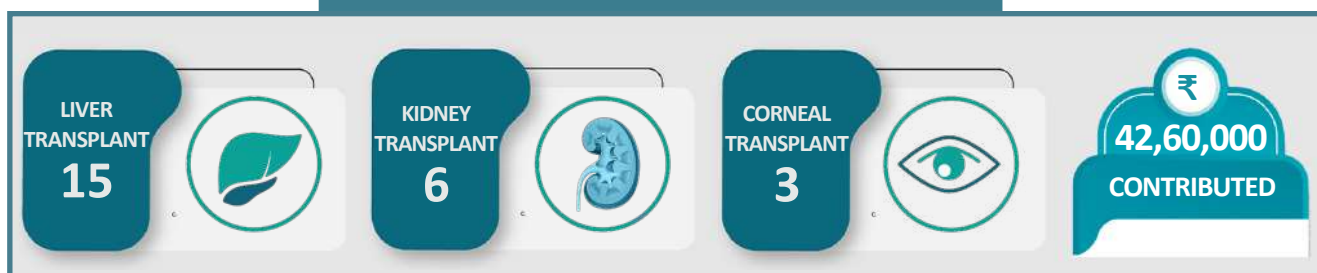

Anudaan - Making Transplants Affordable has been committed to making life saving organ transplantation accessible to all those who need it in India. This initiative aims to enable and support financial assistance for organ transplantation for economically disadvantaged patients through crowd funding. One becomes eligible for help under the Anudaan initiative for a grant if their annual household income is less than or equal to Rs. 5 lakhs a year. The hospital is expected to offer support to the poor patient via a subsidized transplant cost, possibly under their CSR. Finally, the Anudaan Committee also reviews and evaluates overall funds that are raised through commitment by self, family, friends or through other Trusts or Foundations and understand the gaps and thereafter commit its support by acting as a bridging organisation.

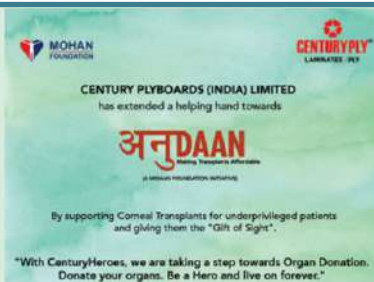

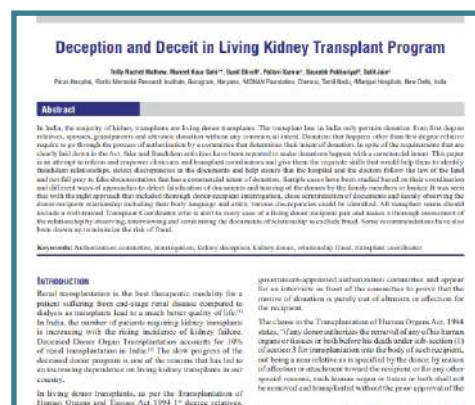

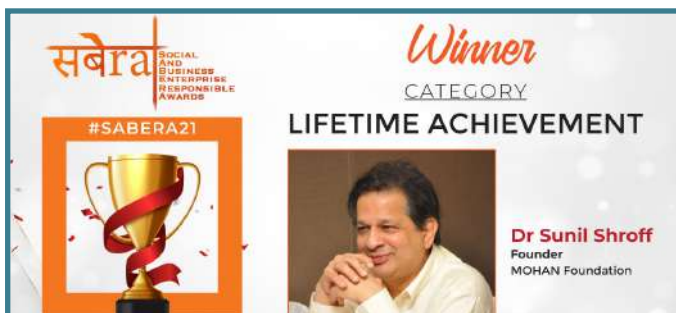
MOHAN Foundation's Expertise Sought in the UAE's Organ Donation Programme
