ABOUT US

MOHAN (Multi Organ Harvesting Aid Network) Foundation is a pioneering NGO with a unique mandate of creating an ecosystem for deceased organ donations to happen in India. MOHAN Foundation was set up in Chennai in the year 1997. It is registered as a Trust vide Register No. 285 of 98 dated 4th August 1997 in Tamil Nadu and has Income Tax exemption under Section 80G. It is an approved recipient under the Foreign Contributions Regulatory Act, 1976. MOHAN Foundation has been saving lives from the past 27 years.

HISTORY

At a time when nobody even thought about deceased organ donation, MOHAN Foundation started its journey in Chennai on January 12, 1997 to give patients with organ failure a new lease of life. Organ donation and transplantation has made it possible for people with organ failure to look forward to a brighter tomorrow filled with hope and promise. It is the brainchild of a group of highly motivated, concerned, and non-commercial group of practicing medical professionals and non-medical professionals to promote the cause of "Organ Donation." The Foundation now has offices in Chennai (HQ), Hyderabad, Bengaluru, Delhi-NCR, Jaipur, Chandigarh, Nagpur and Imphal.

To ensure that every Indian that is suffering from end stage organ failure be provided with the gift of a "new lease of quality life," through a lifesaving organ transplant.





DELHI - On November 24, 2022, MOHAN Foundation-Delhi NCR in association with National Organ & Tissue Transplant Organization (NOTTO) organized a special screening of the movie "Aye Zindagi" at PVR Promenade, Vasant Kunj, New Delhi. **100 people watched the screening.**

CHENNAI - On March 25, 2023, the Department of Nephrology at MMM Hospital in Chennai and the MOHAN Foundation presented a free screening of the film "Aye Zindagi: Life Finds a Way." Students of the MMM College of Nursing and Allied Health Professions, as well as physicians and MOHAN Foundation supporters, were invited. 400 people attended the screening.

Edelweiss Tokio Life Insurance (ELTI) launched a campaign, titled, "Zindagi Express," a relay marathon, for raising awareness about deceased organ donation.

On January 5, 2023, ETLI launched 'Zindagi Express', a relay marathon at Hyderabad to raise awareness about deceased organ donation. In three weeks, the Zindagi Express visited fifty locations in multiple states. It travelled 5,500 kilometres to raise awareness. For the fourth consecutive year, MOHAN Foundation partnered with the life insurance company to raise awareness about organ donation. The final halt was in Bhopal on January 22, leaving a heart-shaped imprint on the map of India, symbolising the importance of having a big heart and donating organs.



Ramp Walk for Life - An Initiative to Save Lives and Livelihoods

On December 23, 2022, the MOHAN Foundation Hyderabad Team commemorated 25 years of saving lives with a one-of-a-kind "Ramp Walk for Life," in which luminaries from various walks of life walked the ramp in Telangana Weaves to demonstrate their support for the cause of organ donation.

To raise awareness about organ donation, notable doctors, celebrities, transplant recipients, and donor families walked the ramp wearing Telangana weaves. Actress Revathy, who was the first celebrity to pledge to donate organs when the MOHAN Foundation was founded, was the Guest of Honour at the event, which was held in partnership with the Abhihaara Foundation, an NGO promoting organ donation.

Close to 30 luminaries walked the ramp and 150 attended the event. Snippets of the ramp walk posted by several luminaries on social media garnered close to 50,000 views across all platforms, making the event a grand success.



ICICI Academy for Skills

MOHAN Foundation organised an awareness drive from November 2022 to March 2023 to educate the trainees at the ICICI Academy for Skills. This drive was in partnership with the Transplants Help the Poor Foundation and the ICICI Foundation. A total of **24 sessions**, **14** face-to-face and **10 online**, were conducted by the Delhi, Mumbai, Hyderabad, Chandigarh, Imphal, Bengaluru, Jaipur and Chennai MOHAN Foundation offices, sensitising **3921 participants**. **394 participants** pledged to donate organs upon death.



Float at the Carnival 2023 in Goa

The MOHAN Foundation had put up a float for the carnival in **Panjim on the 18th, Margao on the 19th, and Mapusa, Goa, on the 21st of February 2023.**Panjim, Margao, and Mapusa witnessed a **huge crowd of approximately 30,000+ people. Nearly 1000 flyers were distributed.**



Rangoli competition - promoting organ donation Toll-Free Helpline number

On **January 21, 2023,** MOHAN Foundation organised a Rangoli Festival in association with Chennai Metro Rail Limited and Uptown Kathipara to promote the cause of organ donation and the national toll-free helpline. The theme of the Rangoli competition was "Gift of Life through Organ Donation". **200 people visited the rangoli area.**



Organ Donation week

All the offices of the Foundation observed Organ Donation Week from **August 8 to 13, 2022**. Multiple awareness talks, online sessions, stalls, information desks, rangoli and poster making competitions, and flash mobs were organized to reach out to maximum people.

Flash Mob in Jaipur

On **August 13, 2022,** MFJCF and Delhi Public School, Jaipur, organized a flash mob at World Trade Park (WTP) to spread awareness about organ donation. This was the first time that a flash mob on a noble cause was performed at WTP, Jaipur. **Close to 1000 people were present during the performance.**



Cycle Rally in Chennai

On **August 12, 2022,** to commemorate National Organ Donation Day, S. A. College of Arts and Science (SACAS) and MOHAN Foundation organised a cycle rally to raise awareness. 73 students and a young Hyundai volunteer cycled 32 kilometres to raise awareness about organ donation and transplantation.

Information desk & Rangoli Competition, Nagpur

On August 13, 2022, on the occasion of World Organ Donation Day, MOHAN Foundation in association with Transplants – Help the Poor Foundation set up an information desk and conducted an awareness session on organ donation at the Indira Gandhi Government Medical College & Hospital (IGGMCH) Nagpur. A rangoli competition with the theme of organ donation was also organized and the hospital staff took part in it.

Approximately 189 individuals attended the awareness session and 260 people visited the stall.



ORGAN DONATION TOLL FREE HELPLINE NUMBER





TRAININGS

MOHAN Foundation's core competence is in the area of training. Healthcare professionals are provided with a range of courses on different aspects of organ donation and transplantation, available in both online and offline formats. Additionally, we provide courses aimed at educating the general public about organ donation, transplantation, and preventing organ failure.

Face-to-face Transplant Coordinators' Training Programs

Guntur - May 2022

For the first time in Andhra Pradesh, a one-week face-to-face Transplant Coordinators' Training Program was conducted by Jeevandan, Government of Andhra Pradesh, in association with MOHAN Foundation from May 16 - 20, 2022, at the NRI General and Super Speciality Hospital, Guntur. It aimed to address the training needs of the transplant coordinators and covered the different aspects of organ donation and transplantation during the course of five days. Smt. Vidadala Rajini, the honourable Minister for Health, Medical & Family Welfare, Government of Andhra Pradesh was the chief guest for the inaugural ceremony. The training curriculum included a series of lectures on various topics addressed by faculty from MOHAN Foundation and experts from the field.





Mohali - August 2022

MOHAN Foundation, in association with Fortis Hospital, Mohali, and Chandigarh Kidney Foundation, successfully conducted a one-week Transplant Coordinators' Training Program from August 22-26, 2022, at the Fortis Hospital, Mohali. The delegates were from different parts of the country, namely Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, Manipur, Himachal Pradesh and Chandigarh, attended the training program. Apart from the faculty lectures, the training also included group activities on the legal forms and deceased donation pathway. Educational films on 'Brain-stem death testing' and 'Approaching families of potential organ donors - good and poor approaches' (adapted from NHSBT) were shown during the training. Participants were also involved in role play that mimicked real-life scenarios experienced in hospitals.

The course is formatted to educate the medical and paramedical professionals with the key aspects of brainstem death and deceased organ donation in India.





15TH ANNUAL INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE OF NATCO UNDER THE AEGIS OF ISOT

A 2-day conference was organized by the Network and Alliance of Transplant Coordinators (NATCO) on October 15 & 16, 2022, at the Le Meridian Hotel, Nagpur. It took place alongside the 32nd Annual Conference of the Indian Society of Organ Transplantation, which was inaugurated by the Hon. Union Minister of Roadways and Transportation, Shri Nitin Gadkari.

Dr. Sunil Shroff, President, ISOT and Dr. Vivek Kute, Secretary, ISOT, inaugurated the NATCO conference and released the proceedings of the 14th NATCO conference. The event was supported by ZTCC Pune, ZTCC Nagpur, SBI Foundation & SBI Card, and C-Edge.

The theme of the conference was "Power of You," indicating that the Transplant Coordinators had the strength to overcome the two years of pandemic and get back to helping organ failure patients. The conference covered areas such as donation after cardiac death, advocacy for living donors, safeguarding the transplant coordinators in living donation, reducing the time for organ transport, and the role of palliation in transplants.

COMMONWEALTH TRIBUTE TO LIFE PROJECT




On the Commonwealth Day, March 14, 2022, the 54 commonwealth nations witnessed the launch of an important initiative on organ donation and transplantation entitled Tribute to Life.

The objective of this voluntary initiative was sharing of knowledge and expertise to promote ethical organ and tissue donation and transplantation, regardless of transplant infra-structure, for the benefit of all Commonwealth citizens. These benefits include -

- 1. Gaining of knowledge through the sharing of guidelines, protocols, teaching material, mentorship and training via self-funded sabbatical.
- 2. Supporting progress in those nations where organ transplantation is well established, but where there is continued unmet need in more ethnically diverse communities.
- 3. Exploring the potential for commencing transplantation in countries where it does not exist.
- 4. Encouraging Commonwealth citizens to participate in activities related to their country of historical origin, and also share with them success stories from their country of origin.
- 5. Protecting vulnerable Commonwealth citizens against illegal and unethical transplantation.
- 6. Saving and transforming the lives of thousands of patients.





- 2. Workshops with the Experts Dr. Pooja Lakhani, a certified nutritionist and transplant dietician and Founder of POSHAN Mantra was invited to conduct a Patient Education Webinars on the following topics - Nutrition Post Transplant - For Heart and Lung transplant recipients on May 15, 2022, and Managing Diabetes Post Transplant on July 31, 2022.

'Kidney care and Women' - A closed group meeting was conducted on Nov 19, 2022, with experts Dr Rajeevalochana P. (Nephrologist) and Dr Meera V Ragavan (Gynaecologist) – 15 female TRIOMPH members attended the session and had wonderful interaction sharing their experiences and challenges.

5. Informative Workshops for Dialysis Patients called 'Kidney Transplants - A Gift of Life'

Informative workshops on 'Kidney Transplants' were conducted in multiple languages, for empowering Dialysis patients and Caregivers, with information on transplant options, processes, avenues of financial aid and what to expect after a transplant. Interactions with a kidney recipient and a living donor were also facilitated through the workshops for enabling first-hand sharing of experiences and dispelling fear about kidney transplantation. The main objective was to motivate the dialysis patients to consider treatment options that have the power of drastically improving their quality of life.

May 21, 2022 - Online workshop in Punjabi for Nephroplus's Punjabi speaking patients –460 views July 16, 2022 - Hybrid workshop for patients of Accord Hospital, Faridabad. Around 30 attended face to face (F2F) and online views were 403.

March 16, 2023 - F2F workshop at Nephroplus Borivali (Mumbai) – attended by 30 patients and caregivers.

March 18, 2023 - F2F workshop at Nephroplus centre at Sagar Hospital, Bengaluru – attended by 25 patients and caregivers.





6. Patient Information Booklets: 'FAQs on Kidney transplant'

MOHAN Foundation has created booklets on 'FAQs on Kidney Transplant', which addresses various doubts and questions in the minds of transplant candidates and patients suffering from chronic kidney failure. It addresses FAQs pertaining to Pre-transplant, Transplant Surgery, Post Transplant and Life after Transplant. In the previous year, the English and Telugu versions were created and distributed to more than 8000 dialysis patients of Nephroplus in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. This year, the booklet was translated to Hindi and distributed to more than 7,500 Hindi-speaking patients with Nephroplus.

7. Counselling of TANKER Foundation's Dialysis Patients in Chennai

Mrs. Usha Balasubramanian, Chennai Chapter Lead of TRIOMPH, has been counselling dialysis patients of the TANKER Foundation. She spends time with the patients individually, counsels them, motivates them to take better care of themselves, explains to them the importance of dietary changes, exercising, and focusing on mental health, and hears them out as they share their difficulties and challenges. During the year, she has counselled 241 dialysis patients in the following units of the TANKER Foundation:

- Valasaravakkam Unit 69 (July and August 2022)
- Padi Unit 18 (September 2022)
- Thiruvottriyur Unit 92 (October and November 2022)
- Retteri Unit 62 (December 2022 February 2023)





8. #GetFit with TRIOMPH

In June 2022, TRIOMPH created a fitness group, consisting of interested members to motivate each other and be the fitness buddy for another person. The group met online and undertook a combined target of achieving at least 2 lakh steps per month. They actually ended up achieving 20 lakh steps.

MANIPUR STORY

With help from the SBI Foundation, MOHAN Foundation began working in the Northeast in 2018. This was a bold and far-sighted move. This was the first time something like this had been done in a formal way in the area, which has a lot of needs and not enough infrastructure or facilities.MOHAN Foundation started working in the state-run government hospital, the Jawahar Lal Institute of Medical Sciences (JNIMS), to start transplantation so that people in need could benefit. The Foundation helped the urologist at the hospital get more advanced training in transplantation in UK. There were meetings with key people and training workshops. Even though COVID-19 slowed things down, the MF staff worked closely with the kidney transplant team and helped get the living kidney transplant program started in May 2022.

To date, twenty-seven transplants have been performed, providing patients with end-stage renal disease, whose only hope was a life-saving transplant, a new lease of life.

Three hundred and sixty medical and paramedical staff were sensitised on deceased organ donation, in public and private hospitals in Imphal. More than 2500 people were sensitized on organ donation through awareness sessions and interactions in information kiosks and events like walkathon & local celebrity endorsements.

Highlights

Manipur state's First Living Kidney Transplant

The month of June 2022 was a historic month as it marked the beginning of the living donor kidney transplantation program. The first living renal transplantation of JNIMS, Imphal, was performed on June 18, 2022. Hon'ble Chief Minister of the state, Shri N. Biren Singh visited JINIMS on July 26, 2022, and congratulated the entire team. He also officially discharged the first recipient. During his visit, he announced a reward of Rs. 5 Lakhs to the entire team involved in the transplants.

Workshop on the Role of Police in Medico-Legal Cases in organ donation at Manipur Police Training Academy, Pangei, Imphal-Manipur

On December 08, 2022, a workshop was organised for the first time in Manipur by the MOHAN Foundation to educate the police personnel on their role in medicolegal cases involving organ donation. The aim of the workshop was to make the police personnel understand the concept of organ donation, their role in MLC, and the process of organ donation in such cases. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Rashini Yengkhom, MPS, MPTC, and Pangei. Close to 100 police personnel participated in the workshop.

Walkathon from Kangla Western gate to JNIMS

On December 09, 2022, a walkathon was organised for the first time in Manipur by the MOHAN Foundation in collaboration with the Jawaharlal Nehru Institute of Medical Sciences (JNIMS) and Shija Hospital and Research Institute Pvt. Ltd. to create awareness on organ donation and generate public support for the cause. The walkathon drew about 300 people from various walks of life.









POLICE SENSITIZATION INITIATIVES

The police play an integral role in deceased organ and tissue donation (medico-legal cases). An initiative to educate them on their role in facilitating multi-organ donation was initiated by MOHAN Foundation. The Foundation conducted 12 training sessions, sensitising 1241 police personnel.

Manipur

On December 8, 2022, a workshop was organised for the first time in Manipur at the Manipur Police Training Academy, Pangei, Imphal. The objective of the training was to educate the police personnel on their role in medicolegal cases involving organ donation. Ms. Pallavi Kumar was the eminent speaker; she was accompanied by Ms. Laishram Monica Devi, Program Officer, and Ms. Th. Udayini Khuman, Transplant Coordinator of the Manipur branch. The training was attended by the Inspector General of Police (IGP), Assistant Director of MPTC, Inspectors, Sub-Inspectors (SI), and Assistant Sub-Inspectors (ASI) from various police stations. Close to 100 police personnel participated in the workshop.

Gurugram

On October 20, 2022, another training workshop was organised at the DCP Headquarters, Gurugram. The training was attended by Inspectors, Sub Inspectors and Assistant Sub Inspectors (ASI) from 30 police stations under Gurugram Commissionerate, Government of Haryana. 30 police personnel attended the training.









ANUDAAN - MAKING TRANSPLANTS AFFORDABLE

Anudaan is an endeavor of MOHAN Foundation to provide help to the economically poor and needy patients so that they can also have access to life-saving organ donation and transplantation. Anudaan aims to support such poor patients by joining hands with philanthropic individuals, corporates and other NGOs and by helping such patients raise funds through crowd funding.

There are very few public hospitals performing transplants. More than 95% of organ transplants especially of organs like livers and hearts are currently performed in the private sector where costs range from Rs. 20 to 25 lakhs. Even relatively less complex kidney transplants cost between Rs. 8 to 10 lakhs. More State Governments need to pave the way for making transplants affordable and help patients with post-transplant medication support. Till then, NGOs and such entities need to come forward to bridge the gap.


Anudaan is a new initiative started in the year 2021. Since our inception, we have supported close to 50 liver and kidney and several corneal transplants.

Organ Transplants Supported by Anudaan








































AWARDS AND ACCOLADES
